Notes to the Financial Statements

Year ended 30 September 2019

1 GENERAL INFORMATION

The company is a private company limited by shares and is registered in England and Wales. The address of the registered office is 16 KHARTOUM ROAD, ILFORD, IG1 2NP, United Kingdom.

2 STATEMENT OF COMPLIANCE

These financial statements have been prepared in compliance with FRS 102 Section 1A, 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable to the UK and Republic of Ireland'.

3 ACCOUNTING POLICIES

BASIS OF PREPARATION

The financial statements have been prepared on the historical cost basis, as modified by the revaluation of certain assets.

The financial statements are prepared in sterling, which is the functional currency of the company.

TURNOVER

Turnover is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable for goods and services supplied during the financial year, net of trade discounts and Value Added Tax.

The turnover in the financial statements represents amounts receivable exclusive of Value Added Tax and trade discounts, of letting students' accommodation and ancillary services rendered in the normal course of the business during the financial year.

CURRENT TAX

Current tax is recognised on taxable profit for the current and past periods. Current tax is measured at the amounts of tax expected to pay or recover using the tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted at the reporting date.

TANGIBLE ASSETS

Tangible assets are initially measured at cost, and are subsequently measured at cost less any accumulated depreciation and accumulated impairment losses or at a revalued amount.

Any tangible assets carried at a revalued amount are recorded at the fair value at the date of revaluation less any subsequent accumulated depreciation and subsequent accumulated impairment losses.

An increase in the carrying amount of an asset as a result of a revaluation is recognised in other comprehensive income and accumulated in capital and reserves. However, the increase is recognised in profit or loss to the extent that it reverses a revaluation decrease of the same asset previously recognised in profit or loss. A decrease in the carrying amount of an asset as a result of revaluation is recognised in other comprehensive income to the extent of any previously recognised revaluation increase accumulated in capital and reserves. If a revaluation decrease exceeds the accumulated revaluation gains accumulated in capital and reserves in respect of that asset, the excess is recognised in profit or loss.

Depreciation is calculated so as to write off the cost of an asset, less its estimated residual value, over the useful economic life of that asset as follows:

Land and buildings 10% straight line on building improvements on the leasehold property. Investment properties are not depreciated.

Fixtures, fittings and 20% reducing balance. equipment

INVESTMENT PROPERTIES

Investment property is measured initially at cost, which includes purchase price and any directly attributable expenditure. Investment property is revalued to its fair value at each reporting date and any changes in fair value are recognised in profit or loss.

If a reliable measure of fair value is not available without undue cost or effort it shall be transferred to tangible assets and accounted for under the cost model until it is expected that fair value will be reliably measurable on an on-going basis.

IMPAIRMENT

A review for indicators of impairment is carried out at each reporting date, with the recoverable amount being estimated where such indicators exist. Where the carrying value exceeds the recoverable amount, the asset is impaired accordingly. Prior impairments are also reviewed for possible reversal at each reporting date.

FINANCIAL INSTRUMENTS

A financial asset or a financial liability is recognised only when the entity becomes a party to the contractual provisions of the instrument.

Basic financial instruments are initially recognised at the transaction price and are subsequently measured as follows: Debt instruments are subsequently measured at amortised cost and commitments to receive a loan and to make a loan to another entity are subsequently measured at amortised cost. Where investments in non-convertible preference shares and non-puttable ordinary shares or preference shares are publicly traded

or their fair value can otherwise be measured reliably, the investment is subsequently measured at fair value with changes in fair value recognised in profit or loss. All other such investments are subsequently measured at cost less impairment.

All other financial instruments, including derivatives, are initially recognised at fair value, which is normally the transaction price and are subsequently measured at fair value, with any changes recognised in profit or loss.

Financial assets that are measured at cost or amortised cost are reviewed for objective evidence of impairment at the end of each reporting date. If there is objective evidence of impairment, an impairment loss is recognised in profit or loss immediately.

All equity instruments regardless of significance, and other financial assets that are individually significant, are assessed individually for impairment. Other financial assets or either assessed individually or grouped on the basis of similar credit risk characteristics.

Any reversals of impairment are recognised in profit or loss immediately, to the extent that the reversal does not result in a carrying amount of the financial asset that exceeds what the carrying amount would have been had the impairment not previously been recognised.

DEFINED CONTRIBUTION PENSION PLAN

Contributions to defined contribution plans are recognised as an expense in the period in which the related service is provided. Prepaid contributions are recognised as an asset to the extent that the prepayment will lead to a reduction in future payments or a cash refund.

OPERATING LEASES

A lease is classified as an operating lease if it does not transfer substantially all the risks and rewards incidental to ownership. Lease payments are recognised as an expense over the lease term on a straight-line basis. The aggregate benefit of lease incentives is recognised as a reduction to expense over the lease term, on a straight-line basis.

4 AVERAGE NUMBER OF EMPLOYEES

The average number of persons employed by the company during the year was 4 (2018: 7.00).

The amount in trade creditors includes deferred income i.e. rent receivable which is partly relating to the next financial period and also rent deposits which are held at the end of the financial period.

The loans shown above are installment loans, secured on the company's assets. All the loans fall due for repayment between two to five years. There are no debts that fall due for repayment after five years.

9 GUARANTEES AND OTHER FINANCIAL COMMITMENTS

The company had annual financial commitments of £150,000 for rent payable under an operating lease, which expired in February 2019. Afterwards, the company is responsible to pay the quarterly rent due in advance for as long as it occupies the leasehold property, which at the end of the financial year was £37,500 per quarter.

10 DIRECTOR'S ADVANCES, CREDIT AND GUARANTEES

LOANS TO COMPANY DIRECTOR/SHAREHOLDER:

In total, loans amounting to £200,000 were advanced to the company's director/shareholder (Mr C. Chrysanthou) during the financial year (£150,000 in 2018). The interest rate charged on the outstanding loans during the financial year was 3% (3% in 2018) and for the financial year, the interest charged was £5,127 (£3,760 in 2018). The amount of loans outstanding as at the end of the financial year was £138,000 (£113,000 in 2018). The outstanding loans are repayable on demand.

11 RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

LOANS TO COMPANY DIRECTOR/SHAREHOLDER - As per note above relating to directors' advances.

DIRECTORS' CURRENT ACCOUNT:

At the end of the financial year the company owed its director £508 (£5,211 in 2018).

DIVIDENDS:

In the financial year 2019, dividends of £175,000 (£155,000 in 2018) were paid to the company's registered shareholder.

DIRECTORS' REMUNERATION:

The directors' remuneration for the financial year was £11,850 (£11,425 in 2018).

RENT TO LANDLORD:

During the financial year, rent of £150,000 (£150,000 in 2018) was payable to the landlord. There is a family beneficial interest in the landlord's business through a trust.

LOAN RECEIVED FROM A RELATED PARTY:

The outstanding loan which was received (in 2018 of £400,000) from a family related person, due to the company's needs, was £270,000 at the end of the financial year (£400,000 in 2018). It is an interest free loan and the loan is repayable on demand when the lender serves the company with a three months written notice to do so.

PROPERTY ACQUISITION FROM A RELATED PARTY:

In the financial year 2018, a property was acquired from a related entity (there was a family relation between the two entities) at market value for the amount of £1,000,000 based on a professional valuation obtained before the acquisition.

12 CONTROLLING PARTY

The ultimate controlling party at the end of the financial year was Mr Chrisanthos Chrysanthou who held 100% of the company's share capital.
