In the year November 2018 to October 2019 The Calon Cymru Network submitted tenders to Carmarthenshire County Council for the design of sustainable regeneration for three towns in Carmarthenshire, Llandeilo, Llandovery and Glanaman; and to the Welsh Government for the Foundational Economy Challenge Fund for a project to embed compliance with the Environment (Wales) Act 2016 in planning policy and decisions. Neither tender was successful.

The tender for the Foundational Economy Challenge Fund took the most time. This is a summary of aims:

- How meeting the 85% emissions reduction target will impact the foundational economy in the corridor of the Heart of Wales railway.
- Identification of measures required in individual communities to achieve the necessary reductions, while also meeting all seven goals of the Well-being of Future Generations Act and fulfilling the Environment Act.

Highlighting the opportunities that exist to move towards those goals in the short, medium and long term (e.g. renewable energy, agricultural diversification, short farming and food supply
chains, low-carbon and carbon-negative buildings, sustainable transport networks).
The Calon Cymru Network also submitted a consultation response for the National
Development Framework, suggesting that the proposed framework was too focused on growth and paid insufficient attention to long-term resilience or to those Technical Advice
Notes dealing with low-impact development.
