1 Introduction and Statutory Information

- 1.1 I, Jonathan Mark Williams, of Bishop Fleming, 2nd Floor Stratus House, Emperor Way, Exeter Business Park, Exeter, EX1 3QS was appointed as Liquidator of Park View Resorts Limited (the "Company") on 7 November 2017 in succession to Mr Jeremiah Anthony O'Sullivan who had been appointed Liquidator on 16 March 2016. My appointment was made by order of the High Court of Justice, Chancery Division, Bristol District Registry dated 7 November 2017 in view of Mr O'Sullivan's retirement from Bishop Fleming. A copy of the Order is available on request.
- 1.2 This report provides an update on the progress in the liquidation for year ended 15 March 2019 (the **Period**).
- 1.3 Information about the way that we will use, and store personal data on insolvency appointments can be found at www.bishopfleminginsolvency.co.uk/privacy-policy. If you are unable to download this, please contact us and a hard copy will be provided to you
- 1.4 The trading address of the Company was Park View, Turks Lane, Poole, Dorset, BH14 8EW.
- 1.5 The registered office of the Company was changed to Bishop Fleming, 2nd Floor Stratus House, Emperor Way, Exeter Business Park, Exeter, EX1 3QS and its registered number is 08393064.

2 Progress of the Liquidation

- 2.1 At Appendix A, I have provided an account of my Receipts and Payments for the Period, with a comparison to the Declaration of Solvency values together with a cumulative account since Mr O'Sullivan's appointment.
- 2.2 All Company assets have been realised and have been previously reported on.

3 Creditors' Claims

Unsecured Creditors

- 3.1 The Director's sworn Declaration of Solvency included 4 creditor amounts. Each of these creditors have been or will be settled by the Director personally and no claims will therefore fall to be met in the Liquidation.
- 3.2 Potential creditor claims include ones arising from the Company's final accounts up to the date of liquidation. These accounts have been submitted during the Period and various payments have been made personally by the sole director in settlement of corporation tax liabilities, penalties and interest arising.
- 3.3 I have however yet to receive confirmation that all liabilities have been settled and along with the dates and amounts of all payments made. Without that latter information in particular I am unable to calculate the Company's liability to Statutory Interest on Crown debts settled during the liquidation.
- 3.4 HMRC's recently changed policy requires the payment of Statutory Interest on Crown debts settled in Members' Voluntary Liquidations, relying on a decision in one of the Lehman's cases.
- 3.5 In particular, HMRC now require the payment of Statutory Interest at 8% from the commencement of the liquidation on any Corporation Tax due that falls due for payment after that date, even if payment is made before the normal due date.

- 3.6 Only when this is calculated, agreed by HMRC and paid can I seek the necessary clearance from HMRC to close the liquidation.
- 3.7 As previously reported it has not been possible for the Company to make payment in full in respect of Crown debts within the period of twelve months from commencement of the liquidation. However I remain content to rely on the understanding that the Director will meet any and all such claims arising from that process, including any penalties and interest relating to the late payment of the Company's Corporation Tax liability and associated accountants' fees.

4 Distributions to Members

- 4.1 The following in specie distribution to the sole member have been made since the date of the Liquidator's appointment:
 - £250,000 per share on 4 April 2016.

5 Liquidator's Remuneration

- 5.1 The sole member approved that the basis of the Liquidator's remuneration be fixed by reference to the time properly spent by him and his staff in managing the Liquidation. The agreed fees were not to exceed £750 inclusive of VAT plus disbursments without the approval of the sole member.
- 5.2 My time costs for the Period are £2,302.25. This represents 9.50 hours at an average rate of £242.34 per hour. Attached as Appendix B is a Time Analysis which provides details of the activity costs incurred by staff grade during this period in respect of the costs fixed by reference to time properly spent by me in managing the Liquidation.
- 5.3 Also attached as Appendix B1 is a cumulative Time Analysis which provides details of the total time costs incurred since the date of liquidation.
- 5.4 I would confirm that the agreed fee of £625.00 plus disbursements of £493.00 has been drawn and settled personally by the Director.
- 5.5 Attached as Appendix C is additional information in relation to the Liquidator's fees.

7 Members' Rights

- 7.1 Within 21 days of the receipt of this report, members with either at least 5% of the total voting rights of all the members having the right to vote at general meetings of the Company or with the permission of the court, may request in writing that the Liquidator provide further information about his remuneration or expenses which have been itemised in this progress report.
- 7.2 Any members with at least 10% of the total voting rights of all the members having the right to vote at general meetings of the Company may within 8 weeks of receipt of this progress report, make an application to court on the grounds that, in all the circumstances, the basis fixed for the Liquidator's remuneration is inappropriate and/or the remuneration charged or the expenses incurred by the Liquidator, as set out in this progress report, are excessive.

8 Next Report

8.1 I am required to provide a further report on the progress of the liquidation within two months of the end of the second anniversary of the liquidation, unless I have concluded matters prior to this, in which case I will write again with my proposed final account.

Additional Information in Relation to Liquidator's Fees

1 Staff allocation and the use of subcontractors

- 1.1 The general approach to resourcing our assignments is to allocate staff with the skills and experience to meet the specific requirements of the case.
- 1.2 The constitution of the case team will usually consist of a Partner, a Manager, and an Administrator or Assistant. The exact constitution of the case team will depend on the anticipated size and complexity of the assignment and the experience requirements of the assignment.
- 1.3 We are not proposing to utilise the services of any sub-contractors in this case.

2 Professional Advisers

2.1 On this assignment we have used the professional advisors listed below. We have also indicated alongside, the basis of our fee arrangement with them, which is subject to review on a regular basis.

2.2 Our choice was based on our perception of their experience and ability to perform this type of work, the complexity and nature of the assignment and the basis of our fee arrangement with them.

3 Liquidator's Disbursements

- 3.1 Category 1 disbursements do not require approval by members. The type of disbursements that may be charged as a Category 1 disbursement to a case generally comprise of external supplies of incidental services specifically identifiable to the case, such as postage, case advertising, invoiced travel and external printing, room hire and document storage. Also chargeable will be any properly reimbursed expenses incurred by personnel in connection with the case.
- 3.2 Category 2 disbursements do require approval by members. These disbursements can include costs incurred by Bishop Fleming LLP for the provision of services which include an element of recharged overhead, for example, room hire or document storage.
- 3.3 Details of the Liquidator's disbursements and expenses incurred to date can be found in the body of the report.

4 Charge-out rates

4.1 A schedule of Bishop Fleming LLP's charge-out rates was issued to members at the time the basis of the Liquidator's remuneration was approved. There have been no material increases in charge-out rates since that date, although rates have been reviewed annually on 1 July each year. A schedule of our current rates is attached, together with a summary of our charge out rates in the past 5 years.

Most of the work on the assignment will be undertaken by specialist staff in the Business Recovery & Insolvency department, but some tasks will be performed by other staff in the General Practice, Corporate Finance, Taxation, Payroll and Administration departments where appropriate, which will be charged out at their normal rates.

Time is usually charged in units of 0.1 hour (i.e. 6 minutes) but the minimum unit of time that may be recorded is 0.017 of an hour (1 minute).

Disbursements

In accordance with Statement of Insolvency Practice 9 (SIP9) disbursements are categorised as either Category 1 or Category 2.

Category 1 Disbursements

These are costs where there is specific expenditure directly referable both to the appointment in question and a payment to an independent third party. These may include, for example, advertising, room hire, storage, postage, telephone charges, travel expenses, and equivalent costs reimbursed to the office holder or his or her staff.

Category 1 disbursements can be drawn without prior approval, although an office holder should be prepared to disclose information about them in the same way as any other expenses.

Category 2 Disbursements

These are costs that are directly referable to the appointment in question but not to a payment to an independent third party. They may include shared or allocated costs that can be allocated to the appointment on a proper and reasonable basis, for example, business mileage.

Category 2 disbursements may be drawn if they have been approved in the same manner as an office holder's remuneration. When seeking approval, an office holder should explain, for each category of expense, the basis on which the charge is being made.

Bishop Fleming LLP proposes to recover category 2 disbursements as follows:

Insolvency Practitioner and staff mileage re-imbursement at HMRC approved 'AMAP' rates
 currently 45p / mile plus 5p / mile for each additional Bishop Fleming LLP passenger
