#### REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2016

The trustees and the directors of the charitable company, present their report and the accounts of the charity for the year ended 31 March 2016.

We have referred to the guidance contained in the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit when reviewing our aims and objectives and in planning our future activities.

#### STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

#### Governing document

The company was incorporated on 19 June 2013 under a memorandum of association, which established the objects and powers of the charitable company and is governed under its articles of association.

#### Appointment of the trustees

Trustees may appoint a person who is willing to act to be a Trustee, either to fill a vacancy or as an additional Trustee. A Trustee so appointed shall be part of the appointments rotation as detailed in the Trusts Articles of Association paragraphs 24 and 25.

Members of the charity guarantee to contribute an amount not exceeding £1, to the charity in the event of winding up.

#### Risk management

The trustees review the risks that are faced by the charity, and establish systems to manage those risks taking professional advice where appropriate.

#### **OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES**

The objective of the charity is to provide inclusive activities and facilities for young people and for the residents of Eastleigh and the neighbourhood. This is achieved by running and maintaining the Pavilion on the Park in Eastleigh and supporting and initiating various events and activities.

#### **ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE**

#### Public Benefit

The trustees have managed the increase in use of the Pavilion on the Park involving more local people in volunteering and more young people and residents in participation.

# REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES FOR THE PERIOD ENDED 31 MARCH 2016

#### Review of the period

The New Nightingale Annexe opened its doors in November 2015 followed by an official opening by HM Lord Lieutenant Nigel Atkinson Esq. in February 2016. There are still fiancial and administrative issues to resolve, but without doubt we have an impressive building that reflects its surroundings and already provides an activity base for several local organisations. The Nightingale Pre School now meets in the Annexe every weekday. We were pleased to welcome the 4th Eastleigh Scout Group who are a key element of our new community provision. The Annexe also allowed us to open a community cafe, and we host daily provision for HCC Adult Services 'Community Link'.

Our flagship accessible cycling project was awarded a three-year funding grant from Children in Need. Cycles4all supported more than 500 children, young people and adults with disabilities to get active on the park on one of our 22 adapted cycles across 250 sessions through the year, come rain or shine.

Sensory4all enabled more than 100 families and 100 children, young people and adults with disabilities to engage in multi-sensory experiences in our multi-sensory facility across 20 facilitated sensory sessions.

Lunch club provided 500 hot healthy meals to more than 100 adults with disabilities at one of our 50 Wednesday lunch clubs. The Boccia Club enabled more than 100 adults with disabilities to participate in the Paralympic sport of Boccia at our 50 weekly coach-led Boccia activity sessions.

Easter and Summer playschemes provided fun, active and engaging holiday activities for more than 100 children aged 6-12 across 8 playscheme days.

ParkSide supported more than 250 young people with information, advice and support across 40 drop-in sessions and 20 detached sessions.

The Trust has welcomed new Trustees onto the Board, and is indebted to all Trustees for their commitment. The Trust records its considerable appreciation to its Community Development Manager, its small staff team and our most valuable resource...our volunteers.

#### Future Plans

Future plans for the charity are as follows:

To use our new facilities to develop the variety of activities offered and in so doing further increase participation and active involvement of young people and the wider local community.

To further develop the expertise of our staff team and trustees and by so doing improve the management of the Trust and the Pavilion on the Park.

#### **FINANCIAL REVIEW**

#### Financial Review

During the year the charity generated a surplus of £352,262. Included within total income of £559,501 is £377,873 relating to grants for towards the Nightingale Annexe.

Of the total fund balances carried forward, £92,085 relates to restricted funds. Unrestricted funds total £926,299 at the 31 March 2016, which includes the property capital fund of £872,930. Free reserves amounted to £53,369 at the end of the year (2015: £24,761).

#### Reserves policy

The Trustees will monitor and review the level of reserves held by the charity in line with the guidance set out by the Charity Commission. The Trustees consider that the aim should be to build up the free reserves of the charity to equal approximately three to six months expenditure. At present free reserves are £53,369, which represents just over 3 months expenditure. The trustees will keep the level of reserves under close review.

#### **DIRECTORS' RESPONSIBILITIES**

The directors are responsible for preparing the report of the trustees and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice (UK GAAP).

The directors are required to prepare the report of the trustees and financial statements for each

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- state whether applicable accounting standards and statements of recommended practice have been followed, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements;
- prepare the accounts on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the company will continue in operation.

The directors are responsible for keeping adequate accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the company and to enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 2006. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the company and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

#### NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2016

#### 1 ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### a) Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities published in July 2014 and the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective January 2015) and the Companies Act 2006.

The charity meets the definition of the public benefit entity under FRSSE 2015. Assets and liabilities are initially recognised at historical cost or transaction value unless otherwise stated in the relevant accounting policy note.

The accounts have been prepared on the going concern basis. There are no material uncertainties about the charity's ability to continue.

#### b) Income

Income is recognised in the statement of financial activities in the year in which it is receivable.

#### c) Expenditure

Expenditure is recognised in the period in which they are incurred. Resources expended include attributable VAT which cannot be recovered.

#### d) Fund accounting

Funds held by the charity are either:

Unrestricted general funds Funds which can be used in accordance with the charitable objects at

the discretion of the trustees.

Designated funds Funds which are set aside for specific purposes by the trustees to be

used in accordance with the charitable objects.

Restricted funds Funds that can only be used for particular restricted purposes within

the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the

donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purpose.

#### e) Tangible fixed assets

Fixed assets are capitalised where the purchase price exceeds £500. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write down the cost of each asset to its estimated residual value over its expected useful life. The depreciation rates in use are as follows:

Land and buildings over 35 years
Assets under construction not depreciated
Furniture and equipment 25% straight line

#### f) Investments

Fixed asset investments are stated at market value.

#### 2 LEGAL STATUS

The charity is a company limited by guarantee and has no share capital. The charitable company was incorporated on 19 June 2013 in England and Wales and was registered on 1 November 2013 with the Charity Commission in England and Wales. The charity is a public benefit entity.
