## OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

The Midsomer Norton Community Trust was incorporated as a limited company on the 10th July 2013. It was registered as a Charity on 23rd November 2018.

As laid out in the Articles of Association The Objects of the Charity are:

- The provision, for the benefit of the inhabitants of Midsomer Norton in Somerset and the surrounding area, of facilities in the interests of social welfare for recreation and other leisure-time occupation for individuals who have need of such facilities by reason of their youth, age infirmity or disability, financial hardship or social circumstances with the objective of improving their conditions of life.
- The advancement, for the benefit of the inhabitants of Midsomer Norton in Somerset and the surrounding area, of such other objects or purposes which are exclusively charitable according to the law of England and Wales in such manner as the Trustees may in their absolute discretion think fit.

The Midsomer Norton Community Trust aims to build a vibrant community in the town offering spaces for groups and running events ourselves to provide recreational activies and other leisure-time occupation for individuals who have need of such facilities by reason of their youth, age infirmity or disability, financial hardship or social circumstances with the objective of improving their conditions of life.

#### **Trustees Annual Report**

Based in Midsomer Norton Town Hall, the Community Trust oversees day to day management of two community buildings within the town – the Town Hall and the Orchard Hall – with the aim of maximising their benefit to the community.

One of the main activities includes the administration of bookings, to promote the use of the Town Hall and Orchard Hall as community centres for local groups to provide services. The majority of usage of the buildings is in the form of lettings to local community groups or hosting arts events and activities.

The Trust runs a popular events programme which includes the Community Cinema, live music concerts and National Theatre Live — all at affordable ticket prices so that residents on very low incomes can take part and feel less isolated. During the week, the buildings provide a home to over 50 of Midsomer Norton's Community Groups who truly support in turn less advantaged people in our community.

The Midsomer Norton Community Trust has also launched groups of its own including the Norton Youth Club (NYC) which is based at the Town Hall, the Midsomer Norton Pride Group and Midsomer Norton Men's Shed based in the neighbouring village of Farrington Gurney.

The Trust organises major events across the town such as M-Fest, the Fayre, Christmas Lights Switch-Ons and Midsomer Norton Pride. It also played a key role in bringing the Carnival back to the High Street. In furtherance of its objectives, the Trust is a registered Charity status with the Charity Commission.

#### **ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE**

Working in partnership with other community groups in the town the Midsomer Norton Community Trust has continues to manage regular programme of cultural activities under the Town Council's Arts Programme. The financial year 2019/20 included the first full year of the upgraded 'Palladium at the Town Hall'. The Midsomer Norton Community Cinema is now a fully-fledged new release cinema – providing real benefit to the local community and continues to go from strength to strength

Significant improvements were made across both the Town Hall and Orchard Hall. Notably B&NES Council fulfilled on their commitment to carryout extensive repairs to the Town Hall bringing it up to standard. In the summer of 2019 a new £75,000 lift was installed in the building which has significantly upgraded access for less able bodied members of the community – providing a totally reliable facility.

#### **FINANCIAL REVIEW**

We hold cash at bank of circa £22,255. Our main source of funds is rental income from community groups that use the Town Hall, the Town Council and that raised from the programme of community events.

The Trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records that disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charity and to enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 2006. The Trustees are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charity and hence taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

The above report has been prepared in accordance with the provisions applicable to companies subject to the small companies regime as set out in Part 15 of the Companies Act 2006 and in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102).

#### 1 Accounting policies

#### **Basis of preparation**

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015) - (Charities SORP (FRS 102)), the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) and the Companies Act 2006.

#### Change in basis of accounting or to previous accounts

There has been no change to the accounting policies (valuation rules and method of accounting) since last year and no changes have been made to accounts for previous years.

#### **Notes to the Accounts**

**Expenditure** 

Recognition of Expenditure is recognised on an accruals basis. Expenditure includes any VAT which

expenditure cannot be fully recovered, and is reported as part of the expenditure to which it

relates.

Expenditure on These comprise the costs associated with attracting voluntary income, fundraising

raising funds trading costs and investment management costs.

Expenditure on These comprise the costs incurred by the Charity in the delivery of its activities and

charitable activities services in the furtherance of its objects, including the making of grants and

governance costs.

Grants payable All grant expenditure is accounted for on an actual paid basis plus an accrual for

grants that have been approved by the trustees at the end of the year but not yet

paid.

Governance costs 
These include those costs associated with meeting the constitutional and statutory

requirements of the Charity, including any audit/independent examination fees, costs linked to the strategic management of the Charity, together with a share of

other administration costs.

Other expenditure These are support costs not allocated to a particular activity.

#### **Taxation**

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

#### Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life:

Fixtures, Fittings &

Equipment

25% straight line

Cinema equipment

25% straight line

#### Freehold investment property

Investment properties are measured initially at cost and subsequently at fair value at each balance sheet date and are not depreciated. All gains or losses are taken to the Statement of Financial Activities as they arise.

#### Intangible fixed assets and amortisation

Intangible fixed assets (including purchased goodwill, patents and trademarks) are carried at cost less accumulated amortisation and impairment losses.

#### **Stocks**

Stock is included at the lower of cost or net realisable value. Donated items of stock are recognised at fair value which is the amount the charity would have been willing to pay for the items on the open market.

#### Trade and other debtors

Trade and other debtors are recognised at the settlement amount due after any trade discount offered. Prepayments are valued at the amount prepaid net of any trade discounts due.

#### **Notes to the Accounts**

#### Trade and other creditors

Short term creditors are measured at the transaction price. Other creditors and provisions are recognised where the charity has a present obligation resulting from a past event that will probably result in the transfer of funds to a third party and the amount due to settle the obligation can be measured or estimated reliably. Creditors and provisions are normally recognised at their settlement amount after allowing for any trade discounts due.

#### 2 Company status

The company is a private company limited by guarantee and consequently does not have share capital.

containers will act as 'Youth Hubs' - bases from which various outreach

sessions can be run for the community.

Youth Club Grant This is the sponsorship grant for the Norton Youth Club initially approved

in 2019. The sessions run on Thursday evenings throughout the year, including school holidays. The sessions will be primarily run in the Town Hall, alongside outreach sessions (again using the Town Hall as a base).
