The company is a town centre partnership, branded as 'Go Kidsgrove', working with local businesses, residents and other local partners to make Kidsgrove a better place to live, work and visit. Some of the activities were as follows:

- "Go Kidsgrove" won a package of support from the Association of Town and City Management
 which included a "Healthcheck" This provided the basis for an action plan to improve specific
 aspects of the environment for thebenefit of all users of the town centre. This also involved a
 number of other partners including hite Town and Borough Councils.
- Partners were brought together to provide, for the first time ever, a Christmas tree in in a
 prominent position in the town centre This was much appreciated by businesses and shoppers
 alike and "Go Kidsgrove" took a much more active role in the organisation of the town's lights
 generally. It has been agreed that the Company will take total responsibility for the lights in
 December 2015 and the majority of the preparation for this has already taken place
- A number of family friendly activities have been organised in and around the town centre
 including Easter and Christmas treasure hunts, heritage walks and storytelling sessions about
 local characters. Over 100 individuals of all ages have taken part in these, learning more about
 local heritage and enjoying the benefits of gentle exercise.
- 7 local craft/vintage businesses took part in an artisan market organised by Go Kidsgrove
 There is now a quarterly craft/vintage market taking place in the town centre which provides
 opportunities for small businesses and attracts footfall to the town.
- 10 local organisations took part in a 'Community day' canal and town centre clean up, improving the environment for all users of the town centre and canal.
- The website is now fully operational and local business are being featured together with any
 special offers. It is our intention to create an enhanced listing for a small fee, available to all
 local businesses in order to create a much needed revenue stream. The Company also
 operates facebook and Twitter accounts for similar purposes.

The local paper, Kidsgrove News, is also used for gauging opinions. The company AGM, held in March provides a forum for stakeholders to voice their opinions, as do the monthly theme group meetings.

One of the biggest concerns of residents and traders alike was the relative lack of Christmas lighting. Much work has ben done in this area with electrical testing of lampposts organised and orders for significant quantites of new lighting equipment put in place for Christmas 2015. Should funding be available, then this programme will be rolled out in forthcoming years.
