Report of the Trustees for the Year Ended 31 March 2023

The trustees who are also directors of the charity for the purposes of the Companies Act 2006, present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 March 2023. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019).

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and aims

The International Association for Forensic Psychotherapy (IAFP) promotes the mental health of offenders and victims through the use of psychotherapeutic understanding, risk assessment, and treatment techniques and advances understanding about forensic psychotherapeutic practice.

Significant activities

- developing educational programs around the world for mental health practitioners, the public, and offenders to enhance their understanding of the principles and practice of forensic psychotherapy
- publishing and disseminating new scholarly articles about forensic psychotherapy
- maintaining a database of knowledge about forensic psychotherapy, including a website available to the public
- Using knowledge about the principles and practice of forensic psychotherapy to inform policy decisions
- encouraging collaborations between practitioners and agencies working with offenders internationally

Public benefit

All of the IAFP's Trustees have had regard to the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit

Report of the Trustees for the Year Ended 31 March 2023

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

Charitable activities

This has been a very productive year in working towards the IAFP's aim to promote the health of offenders and victims through the use of psychotherapeutic understanding, risk assessment and treatment techniques and to advance understanding about forensic psychotherapeutic practice.

Dr Colin Campbell succeeded Dr Carine Minne as President of the IAFP at the Annual Conference in May 2022. Dr Daniel Riordan was elected Vice-President and Wayne Bodkin and Marianna Caserio were elected members of the Executive Board.

Annual Conference

The Annual Conference took place at BMA House London from the 12th-14th May 2022, with the theme, "Violence as a Public Health Emergency: Preventing, Treating and Humanising the Dangerous Mind". Taking the opportunity of this being the 30th Anniversary Annual Conference, the conference explored the past, present and future of forensic psychotherapy. This was a hybrid format conference, providing both the first opportunity for delegates to attend in person since the COVID pandemic, as well as to Join remotely. The Annual Gill McGauley Prize was awarded to Dr Dr Emily Turton of the South London Partnership for a paper entitled "Out of Sight, out of Mind". The 2023 Annual Conference will take place in Turin, with the theme of "From Pain to Violence: Prevention and Intervention".

Evening Seminars

The IAFP evening seminars have been developed to provide a resource throughout the year for members and those with an interest in forensic psychotherapy. The seminars will be bi-monthly and the inaugural seminar will be given by Dr Jacki Craisatti on the 20th April 2023.

Trainees Conference

Acknowledging the educational role of the IAFP, the first Trainees Conference has been planned on the theme of neuro-psychoanalysis in forensic settings. This will take place in January 2024.

National Associations Committee

The National Associations Committee has continued to meet to support the development of national forensic psychotherapy associations and to develop a model of affiliateship to the IAFP. The UK Forensic Psychotherapy Association and the Australian Forensic Psychotherapy Association have become formally affiliated to the IAFP. A national association has been developed in France, with an inaugural conference in Paris later this year and there are plans for further associations in other countries, including Italy and Israel. The Committee is also undertaking scoping work in relation to a possible international forensic psychotherapy training under the auspices of the IAFP.

International Journal of Forensic Psychotherapy

The International Journal of Forensic Psychotherapy continues to go from strength to strength with three successful issues published in the past year, including an issue based around the Annual Conference plenary sessions published in December 2022. The Journal is due to be included in Psychoanalytic Electronic Publishing or "PEP-Web", an online psychoanalytic library.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Reserves policy

The Charity has a reserves policy to hold 3 months costs in reserves to enable the Charity to cover costs and obligations in the event of business closure. At 31 March 2023 the charity had unrestricted reserves of £28,122 which equates to over 2 years of monthly costs.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document

The charity is controlled by its governing document, a deed of trust, and constitutes a limited company, limited by guarantee, as defined by the Companies Act 2006.

The IAFP is governed by a constitution & By-Laws (revised April 2012)

The IAFP is a private company limited by guarantee

Recruitment and appointment of new trustees

The IAFP appointed each of its officers (President, Honorary Life President, Secretary, Treasurer, and Vice President) to be trustees of the Charity. Nominees for these positions (except Honorary Life President) are solicited from the IAFP membership on an annal basis, and elections are then held at the Annual General Meeting. Officers must be members of the IAFP and are elected to three-year terms.

For banking purposes, we agreed that the future treasurers need to be UK based.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charitable company, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.
