The directors present their strategic report for the year ended 31 December 2019.

REVIEW OF BUSINESS

The principle activity of the company was to hold a non-exclusive licence for the titanium metal powder production technology with Metalysis Ltd in return for a royalty over use and a right of first offer in relation to further licences of such technology.

On 3rd June 2019 Metalysis Ltd entered administration. It is the directors' expectation that Metalysis Ltd will be liquidated. The company is awaiting an outcome of this process before any strategic decision is made in regards to the future activities of the company.

During the year, the company incurred administration costs of £5,457 (2018: £13,635).

OTHER PRINCIPAL RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The ultimate holding company, Iluka Resources Limited, maintains a whole of business approach to the management of risks for the group. This approach allows both opportunities and threats to be identified and managed effectively. Iluka has adopted a risk management framework which sets out the processes for the identification and management of threats across the group, for which Iluka Technology (UK) Ltd is a wholly owned subsidiary.

GOING CONCERN

The financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis. The Company has net current liabilities of £613,031 (2017 - £607,574).

The Company's ability to operate as a going concern is assessed in conjunction with Iluka Resources Limited (the Group) as its viability is dependent upon the ability of the Group to settle their intercompany balances with the Company and to provide further funds for working capital needs. Iluka Resources Limited, a company incorporated in Australia, has confirmed that it will continue to provide such funding as the Company may need to meet its financial obligations for the foreseeable future, and for a period of at least 12 months from the date of signing these financial statements, whilst the Company remains a subsidiary of Iluka Resources Limited.

As Metalysis Ltd is currently in the process of liquidation, the company is awaiting an outcome of this process before any strategic decision is made in regards to the future activities of the company.

Notes to the Financial Statements for the Year Ended 31 December 2019

1. STATUTORY INFORMATION

Iluka Technology (UK) Ltd is a private company, limited by shares, registered in England and Wales. The company's registered number and registered office address can be found on the Company Information page.

The presentation currency of the financial statements is the Pound Sterling (£).

2. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Financial Reporting Standard 102 "The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland" and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

The functional currency of the company is that of pounds sterling.

The figures enclosed in the accounts are rounded to the nearest pound.

Financial Reporting Standard 102 - reduced disclosure exemptions

The company has taken advantage of the following disclosure exemption in preparing these financial statements, as permitted by FRS 102 "The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland":

the requirements of Section 7 Statement of Cash Flows.

Financial instruments

The company has elected to apply the provisions of Section 11 'Basic Financial Instruments' and Section 12 'Other Financial Instruments Issues' of FRS102 to all of its financial instruments.

Financial instruments are recognised in the company's balance sheet when the company becomes party to the contractual provisions of the instrument.

Financial assets and liabilities are offset, with the net amounts presented in the financial statements, when there is a legally enforceable right to set off the recognised amounts and there is an intention to settle on a net basis or to realise the asset and settle the liability simultaneously.

Classification of financial liabilities

Financial liabilities and equity instruments are classified according to the substance of the contractual arrangements entered into.

Basic financial liabilities

Basic financial liabilities, including creditors, and loans from fellow group companies are initially recognised at transaction price.

Trade creditors are obligations to pay for goods or services that have been acquired in the ordinary course of business from suppliers. Amounts payable are classified as current liabilities if payment is due within one year or less. If not, they are presented as non-current liabilities. Trade creditors are initially recognised at transaction price.

Foreign currencies

Assets and liabilities in foreign currencies are translated into sterling at the rates of exchange ruling at the balance sheet date. Transactions in foreign currencies are translated into sterling at the rate of exchange ruling at the date of transaction. Exchange differences are taken into account in arriving at the operating result.

Intercompany loans

Intercompany loans are repayable on demand and interest free. As such they are recorded at amortised cost as a basic financial instrument under FRS 102.

10. POST BALANCE SHEET EVENTS

As at 31 December 2019, a limited number of cases of an unknown virus causing pneumonia had been reported to the World Health Organisation (the 'WHO'). Subsequently, further cases were reported and found to be caused by Coronavirus Disease 2019 ("COVID19"). The WHO recognised the outbreak of COVID19 as a pandemic on 11 March 2020. Consequentially, a number of governments implemented measures to contain or limit the spread of COVID19 in various jurisdictions, including those in which Iluka operates. The key measures that may impact Iluka are the closure of various international borders and restrictions on the movement of people.

It is not yet possible to determine the future extent or remaining duration of these measures, and therefore Iluka is presently unable to reliably estimate the potential financial impact of COVID19.

The immediate parent company is Iluka (UK) Ltd, a company incorporated in England & Wales. The ultimate controlling party is considered to be Iluka Resources Limited, a company incorporated in Australia and listed on the Australian Securities Exchange (ASX).
