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Group Strategic Report For the period ended 31 December 2014

The company was incorporated on 27 March 2014. Key West (Holdings) Limited was set up to be a holding company for investment in subsidiaries.

Within Key West (Holdings) Limited, the group had Turnover for the year of £226.7 million (2013: £194.4 million). Profit before tax was £26.9 million (2013: £27.3 million), the fall relating to £1.6 million costs incurred on cost of investment in the year.

On 9 April 2014 Key West (Holdings) Limited acquired 94.4% of the equity share capital of Nisbets PLC by way of a share for share exchange. The transaction qualifies as a group reconstruction within the meaning of Financial Reporting Standard 6, and has been accounted for using the merger accounting method. Accordingly, the financial information for the current period and comparatives have been presented as if Nisbets PLC had been owned by Key West (Holdings) Limited throughout the current and prior periods.

Nisbets plc was the only investment in the year. Nisbets plc is principally engaged in the sale and leasing of catering equipment. Its activities are carried out through the company's branches in the United Kingdom and the Republic of Ireland and subsidiaries in the UK, France, Spain, the Netherlands, China and Australia. Nisbets continues it's record of turnover growth achieving a 17% growth in the year. Turnover for the year ended 31 December 2014 was in line with expectations at £226.7 million. Profit before tax was £28.4 million, an increase of 4% from the prior year (2013: £27.3 million).

After the period end, on 30 January 2015, Key West (Holdings) Limited acquired 60% of the shares in Jongor (Holdings) Limited. Jongor is a catering equipment hire company.

Directors' Report For the period ended 31 December 2014

The directors present their report and the financial statements for the period ended 31 December 2014.

Directors' responsibilities statement

The directors are responsible for preparing the Group strategic report, the Directors' report and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and regulations.

Company law requires the directors to prepare financial statements for each financial year. Under that law the directors have elected to prepare the financial statements in accordance with United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice (United Kingdom Accounting Standards and applicable law). Under company law the directors must not approve the financial statements unless they are satisfied that they give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the company and the group and of the profit or loss of the group for that period. In preparing these financial statements, the directors are required to:

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- make judgments and accounting estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- state whether applicable UK Accounting Standards have been followed, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements;
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the group will continue in business.

The directors are responsible for keeping adequate accounting records that are sufficient to show and explain the company's transactions and disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the company and the group and enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 2006. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the company and the group and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

As Nisbets plc was the only investment in the year by Key West (Holdings) Limited, the policies below relate directly to Nisbets plc.

Environmental policy

Management have continued to develop the group's environmental policy and control the group's environmental impact, recycling 96% of waste in 2014. The group's objective is to consistently develop and improve performance in this area by investment into improved waste steam segration along with promoting stand awareness and training. In addition, the group works with suppliers to ensure that a minimalistic packaging approach and appropriate environmental policies and controls are adopted within their organisations.

Although not currently required to register as a large energy user under the CRC Energy Efficiency Scheme, the group monitors the energy use of its buildings and processes with the aim of continuing to reduce its carbon footprint. It is working to achieve this through a number of measures including the introduction of additional low energy lighting equipment and specialised motion control sensors in both warehouse and office areas.

Financial instruments

The group is exposed to transaction foreign exchange risk which it seeks to hedge using forward exchange rate contracts and put and call options. The fair value of these derivative financial instruments as at 31 December 2014 was £1,938,967 (2013: £2,499,014)).

Colleague involvement

The group's policy is to keep colleagues informed about activities and developments across the business. Local managers are charged with communication and explaining matters affecting them as employees and the financial and economic factors affecting the performance of the group. Other communications and methods used for consulting colleagues and their representatives vary locally according to the country and the nature of colleague representation.

Disabled employees

Applications for employment by disabled persons are given full and fair consideration for all vacancies in accordance with their particular aptitudes and abilities. In the event of colleagues becoming disabled, every effort is made to retain them in order that their employment with the group may continue.

It is the policy of the group that training, career development and promotion opportunities should be available to all colleagues.

Nisbets in the community

As part of its Corporate Social Responsibility activities, the group runs its Nisbets in the Community programme. This is a dedicated long term charitable project which encourages colleagues to get involved in local community projects and make a difference by raising money and volunteering their skills and time. The group also recruits from the local area to tackle unemployment, particularly supporting young people seeking to develop their skills to become more employable.

1. Accounting Policies

1.1 Basis of preparation of financial statements

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with applicable accounting standards under the historical cost convention.

The company is entitled to the merger relief offered by section 131 of the Companies Act 1985 in respect of the acquisition of Nisbets plc.

The group has substantial cash assets and access to further funding if required and the directors therefore consider that there is a reasonable expectation that the group and company have adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future. For this reason, the directors continue to adopt the going concern basis in preparing the financial statements.

1.2 Basis of consolidation

The financial statements consolidate the accounts of Key West (Holdings) Limited and all of its subsidiary undertakings ('subsidiaries').

On 9 April 2014 Key West (Holdings) Limited acquired 94.4% of share capital of Nisbets PLC by way of a share for share exchange. The transaction qualifies as a group reconstruction within the meaning of Financial Reporting Standard 6, and has been accounted for using the merger accounting method. Accordingly, the financial information for the current period and comparatives have been presented as if Nisbets PLC had been owned by Key West (Holdings) Limited throughout the current and prior periods.

1.3 Turnover

Turnover is the total amount receivable by the group for goods supplied and services provided and is recognised on the date of dispatch and provision of service. Turnover excludes VAT and trade discounts.

1.4 Intangible fixed assets and amortisation

Goodwill arising on consolidation, representing the excess of the fair value of the consideration given over the fair values of the identifiable net assets acquired, is capitalised and is amortised on a straight line basis over its estimated useful economic life.

1.5 Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less depreciation. Depreciation is not charged on freehold land. Depreciation on other tangible fixed assets is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost of those assets, less their estimated residual value, over their expected useful lives on the following bases:

Freehold property - 2% - 5% straight line Motor vehicles - 25% reducing balance

Fixtures and fittings - 25% reduced balance / 8% - 33.3% straight line

Computer equipment - 20% - 33.3% straight line

1.6 Investments

Investments in subsidiaries are valued at cost less provision for impairment.

1.7 Lessee accounting

Assets under finance leases and hire purchase contracts are capitalised in the balance sheet and depreciated over their expected useful lives. The interest element of the leasing payments represents a constant proportion of the capital balance outstanding and it charged to the profit and loss account over the period of the lease.

All other leases are regarded as operating leases and the payments made under them are charged to the profit and loss account on a straight-line basis over the lease term.

1.8 Stocks

Stocks is stated at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Cost comprises price plus and costs incurred in the normal course of business to bring the stock to its current location and is calculated on a FIFO basis. Provision is made for slow moving and obsolete stock.

1.9 Deferred taxation

Deferred taxation is recognised on all timing differences where the transactions or events that give the group an obligation to pay tax in the future, or a right to pay less tax in the future, have occurred by the balance sheet date. Deferred tax assets are recognised when it is more likely than not that they will be recovered. Deferred tax is measured using rates of tax that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the balance sheet date. Deferred tax assets and liabilities have not been discounted.

1.10 Foreign currencies

Transactions in foreign currencies are translated at the exchange rate ruling at the date of the transaction. Monetary assets and liabilities in foreign currencies are translated at the rates of exchange ruling at the balance sheet date. The financial statements of foreign subsidiaries are translated at the rate of exchange ruling at the balance sheet date. The exchange differences arising from the retranslation of the opening net investment, at the rate of exchange ruling at the balance sheet date, and of the retained profit for the year, at an average rate for the year, of subsidiaries are taken directly to reserves. All other exchange differences are dealt with through the profit and loss account.

1.11 Contibutions to pension scheme

Defined Contribution Scheme

The pension costs charged against profits represent the amount of the contributions payable to the schemes in respect of the accounting period.

1.12 Finance lease contracts and income - Lessor accounting

Assets leased to customers under arrangements that transfer substantially all the risk and rewards of ownership of the assets, other than legal title, to the leasees are classified as financial leases.

The gross earnings from finance leases (including any items of income incidental to the leases) are allocated to accounting periods using a constant periodic rate of return on the group's net cash investment in the lease and are included in turnover. Initial direct costs, incremental to the group and directly associated with negotiating and consummating the lease transactions, are recognised in the profit and loss account when incurred.

Net investment in finance leases at the balance sheet date represents the minimum lease rentals accruing to the group less the gross earnings allocated to the future periods. There are no guaranteed residual values available to the group at the end of any leases. Unguaranteed residual values are not considered to be material to the group and are not, therefore, reflected in the net investment in finance leases.

Any gains or loss on disposal of assets arising at the end of the lease is included in turnover when all the risks and rewards have been transferred by the group.

Any gains or loss on early terminations of leases, calculated as the difference between the total net sums recovered and the book value of net investment in finance leases, is included in the profit and loss account on the date the lease terminates.

Secondary rentals are recognised in the profit and loss account as they accrue.

1.13 Financial instruments

Financial liabilities and equity instruments are classified according to the substance of the contractual arrangements entered into. An equity instrument is any contract that evidences a residual interest in the assets of the entity after deducting all of its financial liabilities.

Where the contractual obligations of financial instruments (including share capital) are equivalent to a similar debt instument, those financial instruments are classed as financial liabilities. Financial liabilities are presented as such in the balance sheet. Finance costs and gains or losses relating to financial liabilities are included in the profit and loss account. Finance costs are calculated so as to produce a constant rate of return on the outstanding liability.

Where the contractual terms of share capital do not have any terms meeting the definition of a financial liability then this is classed as an equity instrument. Dividends and distributions relating to equity instruments are debited directly to equity.

1.14 Derivative financial instruments

Derivative financial instruments are used to manage exposure to currency risk from fluctuations in exchange rates on future transactions. The group uses a range of finacial instruments to hedge its exposure including forward exchange contracts and options. The group does not hold or issue any derivative financial instruments for trading or speculative purposes. The fair value of derivative financial instruments is disclosed in the Directors' Report.

2. Turnover

The whole of the turnover is attributable to the sale and leasing of catering equipment. An analysis of turnover by geographical market has not been provided as the directors view the group's operations in the United Kingdom, Europe, China, Australia and USA as part of a single market.
