### PRINCIPAL ACTIVITIES

The principal activity of Inspired Europe Holdings Limited ("the Company") is that of an intermediate holding company.

### PRINCIPAL RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Company's operations expose it to a variety of financial risks that include liquidity, interest rate, foreign exchange and market risks. The Company has mechanisms in place that seek to limit the impact of the adverse effects of these risks on the financial performance of the Company.

### Liquidity risk

The Company actively manages its finances to ensure that the Company has sufficient funds available for its operations.

### Interest rate risk

The Company has both interest bearing assets and liabilities. The interest bearing assets and liabilities are cash balances and amounts owed to/from group undertakings, subject to fixed interest rates. The directors keep the interest rate risk under constant review.

### Foreign exchange risk

The Company does not currently use financial instruments to manage the risk of fluctuating exchange rates and as such no hedge accounting is applied. The directors keep these measures under constant review.

### Market risk

The Company actively looks to maintain and improve product quality and customer offerings, which together with established strong customer relationships combine to mitigate market risks.

As part of the Company's disaster recovery planning, the Company has introduced a number of remote learning solutions to mitigate against the potential impact of any unforeseen closure of school premises, as was experienced as part of the COVID-19 pandemic. The provision of such solutions allows the Company's subsidiaries to continue to deliver their primary principal activity of delivering education services

Notwithstanding the uncertainty of the impact of the current COVID-19 pandemic, the Directors of Inspired Education Holdings Ltd consider that there are no material uncertainties that may cast significant doubt about Inspired Education Holdings Ltd's ability to continue as a going concern, and therefore to be able to provide financial support to the Company as is needed.

### POST BALANCE SHEET EVENTS

In January 2022, as part of the internal restructuring of the Group, the Company sold to Inspired Finco Holdings Limited all the shares held in SLS S.p.a. and in International School of Europe S.p.a. for a total consideration of £187,788,102. The investments in SLS S.p.a. and International School of Europe S.p.a. with net book values of £21,695,430 and £57,582,332 respectively were disposed of, resulting in a total gain on sale of subsidiaries of £108,510,340.

### 1 Accounting policies

Inspired Europe Holdings Ltd is a private company limited by shares, incorporated in England and Wales under the Companies Act. The registered office address is included in the 'Company Information' section of this report.

The Company is exempt from the preparation of consolidated financial statements, because it is included in the consolidated group accounts of Inspired Education Holdings Limited. The group accounts of Inspired Education Holdings Limited, the Company's controlling entity and ultimate parent, are available to the public and can be obtained as set out in note 9. These financial statements present information about the Company as an individual undertaking and not about its group.

The Company has applied Financial Reporting Standard 101 'Reduced Disclosure Framework' (FRS 101) issued by the Financial Reporting Council (FRC) incorporating the Amendments to FRS 101 issued by the FRC in July 2015 and the amendments to Company law made by The Companies, Partnerships and Groups (Accounts and Reports) Regulations 2015 that are effective for accounting periods beginning on or after 1 January 2016.

The Company does not have any employees other than the directors. No director received any remuneration for their services to this Company.

These financial statements are presented in pounds sterling because that is the currency of the primary economic environment in which the Company operates.

As permitted by FRS 101, the Company has taken advantage of the disclosure exemptions available under that standard in relation to business combinations, financial instruments, presentation of a cash-flow statement, standards not yet effective and related party transactions (including compensation of key management personnel). Where relevant, equivalent disclosures have been given in the group accounts named above.

The accounting policies set out below have, unless otherwise stated, been applied consistently to all periods presented in these financial statements.

### 1.1 Accounting convention

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention.

### 1.2 Going concern

The financial statements have been prepared on the going concern basis, which the directors believe to be appropriate for the following reasons:

The Company is reliant on financial support from Inspired Education Holdings Limited, the Company's parent undertaking. Inspired Education Holdings Limited has confirmed that for at least 12 months from the date of approval of these financial statements, it will continue to make available such funds as are needed by the Company. ### 1.2 Going concern (continued)

Notwithstanding the uncertainty of the impact of the current COVID-19 pandemic, the Directors of Inspired Education Holdings Ltd consider that there are no material uncertainties that may cast significant doubt about Inspired Education Holdings Ltd's ability to continue as a going concern, and therefore to be able to provide financial support to the Company as is needed.

### 1.3 Investments in subsidiaries

Investments in subsidiaries are accounted for at cost less, where appropriate, provisions for impairment.

### 1.4 Borrowing costs

Borrowing costs are recognised in profit or loss in the period in which they are incurred.

### 1.5 Taxation

Current tax is provided at amounts expected to be paid (or recovered) using the tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the balance sheet date.

Deferred tax is provided in full on timing differences, which result in an obligation at the balance sheet date to pay more tax, or a right to pay less tax, at a future date, at rates expected to apply when they crystallise based on current tax rates and law. Timing differences arise from the inclusion of items of income and expenditure in taxation computations in periods different from those in which they are included in financial statements.

Deferred tax assets are recognised to the extent that it is regarded as more likely than not that they will be recovered. Deferred tax assets and liabilities are not discounted.

Unrelieved tax losses and other deferred tax assets are recognised only to the extent that, on the basis of all available evidence, it can be regarded as more likely than not that there will be suitable taxable profits from which the future reversal of the underlying timing differences can be deducted.

Deferred tax liabilities are recognised for timing differences arising from investments in subsidiaries and associates, except where the Company is able to control the reversal of the timing difference and it is probable that it will not reverse in the foreseeable future.

Where items recognised in other comprehensive income or equity are chargeable to or deductible for tax purposes, the resulting current or deferred tax expense or income is presented in the same component of comprehensive income or equity as the transaction or other event that resulted in the tax expense or income.

Current tax assets and liabilities are offset only when there is a legally enforceable right to set off the amounts and the Company intends either to settle on a net basis or to realise the asset and settle the liability simultaneously.

Deferred tax assets and liabilities are offset only if: a) the Company has a legally enforceable right to set off current tax assets against current tax liabilities; and b) the deferred tax assets and deferred tax liabilities relate to income taxes levied by the same taxation authority on either the same taxable entity or different taxable entities which intend either to settle current tax liabilities and assets on a net basis, or to realise the assets and settle the liabilities simultaneously, in each future period in which significant amounts of deferred tax liabilities or assets are expected to be settled or recovered.

# NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS (CONTINUED) YEAR ENDED 31 AUGUST 2021

### 1.6 Financial instruments

Financial assets and financial liabilities are recognised when the Company becomes a party to the contractual provisions of the instrument.

Financial liabilities and equity instruments are classified according to the substance of the contractual arrangements entered into.

### Financial assets and liabilities

All financial assets and liabilities are initially measured at transaction price (including transaction costs), except for those financial assets classified as at fair value through profit or loss, which are initially measured at fair value (which is normally the transaction price excluding transaction costs), unless the arrangement constitutes a financing transaction. If an arrangement constitutes a financing transaction, the financial asset or financial liability is measured at the present value of the future payments discounted at a market rate of interest for a similar debt instrument.

Financial assets and liabilities are only offset in the statement of financial position when, and only when there exists a legally enforceable right to set off the recognised amounts and the Company intends either to settle on a net basis, or to realise the asset and settle the liability simultaneously.

Debt instruments which meet the following conditions are subsequently measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method:

- (a) The contractual return to the holder is (i) a fixed amount; (ii) a positive fixed rate or a positive variable rate; or (iii) a combination of a positive or a negative fixed rate and a positive variable rate.
- (b) The contract may provide for repayments of the principal or the return to the holder (but not both) to be linked to a single relevant observable index of general price inflation of the currency in which the debt instrument is denominated, provided such links are not leveraged.
- (c) The contract may provide for a determinable variation of the return to the holder during the life of the instrument, provided that (i) the new rate satisfies condition (a) and the variation is not contingent on future events other than (1) a change of a contractual variable rate; (2) to protect the holder against credit deterioration of the issuer; (3) changes in levies applied by a central bank or arising from changes in relevant taxation or law; or (ii) the new rate is a market rate of interest and satisfies condition (a).
- (d) There is no contractual provision that could, by its terms, result in the holder losing the principal amount or any interest attributable to the current period or prior periods.
- (e) Contractual provisions that permit the issuer to prepay a debt instrument or permit the holder to put it back to the issuer before maturity are not contingent on future events, other than to protect the holder against the credit deterioration of the issuer or a change in control of the issuer, or to protect the holder or issuer against changes in levies applied by a central bank or arising from changes in relevant taxation or law.
- (f) Contractual provisions may permit the extension of the term of the debt instrument, provided that the return to the holder and any other contractual provisions applicable during the extended term satisfy the conditions of paragraphs (a) to (c).

Debt instruments that have no stated interest rate (and do not constitute financing transaction) and are classified as payable or receivable within one year are initially measured at an undiscounted amount of the cash or other consideration expected to be paid or received, net of impairment.

# NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS (CONTINUED) YEAR ENDED 31 AUGUST 2021

### 1.6 Financial instruments (continued)

With the exception of some hedging instruments, other debt instruments not meeting these conditions are measured at fair value through profit or loss.

Financial assets are derecognised when and only when a) the contractual rights to the cash flows from the financial asset expire or are settled, b) the Company transfers to another party substantially all of the risks and rewards of ownership of the financial asset, or c) the Company, despite having retained some, but not all, significant risks and rewards of ownership, has transferred control of the asset to another party.

Financial liabilities are derecognised only when the obligation specified in the contract is discharged, cancelled or expires

### 1.7 Interest receivable/payable

All interest receivable/payable is recognised on an accruals basis.

### 1.8 Dividend income

Dividend income is recognised when the right to receive payment is established.

### 1.9 Critical accounting judgements

In the course of preparing the financial statements, no judgements have been made in the process of applying the Group's accounting policies, other than those involving estimations (listed below), that have had a significant effect on the amounts recognised in the financial statements.

### 1.10 Key sources of estimation uncertainty

In the application of the company's accounting policies, which are described above, the directors are required to make judgements, estimates and assumptions about the carrying amounts of assets and liabilities that are not readily apparent from other sources. The estimates and associated assumptions are based on historical experience and other factors that are considered to be relevant. Actual results may differ from these estimates. The estimates and underlying assumptions are reviewed on an ongoing basis. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognised in the period in which the estimate is revised if the revision affects only that period, or in the period of the revision and future periods.

The key sources of estimation uncertainty at the reporting period, that may have a significant risk of causing a material adjustment to the carrying amounts of assets and liabilities within the next financial year, are discussed below.

### Carrying value of investments

The Company tests annually whether investments have suffered any impairment. The recoverable amounts of cash-generating units have been determined based on value in use calculations. The value in use calculation requires the Directors to estimate the future cash flows expected to arise from each investment and a suitable discount rate in order to calculate present value. Central costs are not allocated to individual investments.

### 1.11 Adoption of new and revised Standards

Adoption of IFRS standards that are mandatorily effective for the current year

In the current year, the Company has adopted all new standards issued by the International Accounting Standards Board (IASB) that are mandatorily effective for an accounting period that begins on or after 1 January 2020. Their adoption has not had any material impact on the disclosures or on the amounts reported in these financial statements.

The Company has reviewed the new and revised IFRS Standards that have been issued but are not yet effective. The Directors do not expect the adoption of these Standards to have a material impact on the financial statements.

In January 2022, as part of the internal restructuring of the Group, the Company sold to Inspired Finco Holdings Limited all the shares held in SLS S.p.a. and in International School of Europe S.p.a. for a total consideration of £187,788,102. The investments in SLS S.p.a. and International School of Europe S.p.a. with net book values of £21,695,430 and £57,582,332 respectively were disposed of, resulting in a total gain on sale of subsidiaries of £108,510,340.
