1 Introduction and Statutory Information

- 1.1 I, Peter Anderson, together with Alan Fallows and Alessandro Sidoli of Xeinadin Corporate Recovery Limited (formerly Kay Johnson Gee Corporate Recovery Limited), 1 City Road East, Manchester, M15 4PN, was appointed as Joint Liquidator of Start Up Active Limited ("the Company") on 1 March 2021.
- 1.2 This progress report provides an update on the conduct of the Liquidation for the period from 1 March 2022 to 28 February 2023 ("the Period") and should be read in conjunction with any previous progress reports which have been issued.
- 1.3 Information about the way that this firm will use, and store personal data on insolvency appointments can be found at www.xeinadin.com/privacy-policy. If you are unable to download this, please contact us and a hard copy will be provided to you.
- 1.4 The principal trading address of the Company was 7-9 Macon Court, Crewe, CW1 6EA.
- 1.5 The registered office of the Company has been changed to c/o Xeinadin Corporate Recovery Limited, 1 City Road East, Manchester, M15 4PN and its registered number is 09340818.

2 Receipts and Payments

- 2.1 At Appendix A is my Receipts and Payments Account covering the Period of this report together with a cumulative Receipts and Payments Account for the period from the date of my appointment as Liquidator to the end of the Period covered by this report.
- 2.2 In Section 3 below, you will find an update on the progress made during the Period in realising the Company's assets and dealing with its affairs.

3 Progress of the Liquidation

3.1 This section of the report provides creditors with an update on the progress made in the liquidation during the Period and an explanation of the work done by the Liquidator and his staff.

Administration (including statutory compliance & reporting)

- 3.2 An office holder must comply with certain statutory obligations under the Insolvency Act 1986 and other related legislation. Details about the work I anticipated would need to be done in this area was outlined to creditors in my initial fees estimate/information which was previously agreed by creditors.
- 3.3 Where the costs of statutory compliance work or reporting to creditors exceeds the initial estimate, it will usually be because the duration of the case has taken longer than anticipated, possibly due to protracted asset realisations, which have in turn placed a further statutory reporting requirement on the Liquidators.
- 3.4 As noted in my initial fees estimate/information, this work will not necessarily bring any financial benefit to creditors but is required on every case by statute.

Realisation of Assets

Other Debtors

3.5 As previously reported, the statement of affairs included "other debtors" with an uncertain realisable value. It transpired that the other debtor balances which were shown in the Company's accounts included overdrawn directors' loan accounts ("DLAs") for both directors.

- 3.6 The DLA balances had been agreed in my last report and I was waiting on suitable offers for repayment.
- 3.7 In addition to the DLAs, the Insolvency Service, who were undertaking their own investigations, made the decision that some of the bounce back loan obtained by the Company was not used for business purposes. As such, the Insolvency Service were considering a compensation order against the directors for £32,500.
- 3.8 Given that I was in the process of negotiating settlements for the DLAs I agreed with the Insolvency Service that I would seek to deal with this as part of the DLA settlement.
- 3.9 I instructed Prosperity Law LLP ("Prosperity") to advise and correspond with the Directors throughout this process. After protracted negotiations with the Directors regarding repayment of the DLAs and the claim for the bounce back loan funds, a total combined offer of £32,500 was accepted in full and final settlement of all claims.
- 3.10 Prosperity drew up a settlement agreement and sought charges on the Directors' properties by way of security for deferred payments.
- 3.11 Including in the original offer was deferred payments over a number of years. However, shortly after the settlement was agreed, the Directors advised that the amounts could be discharged in full subject to a discount of £2,000 being given. This was agreed on the basis of the far faster settlement period relative to the amount being discounted
- 3.12 I can confirm that £30,500 has now been received.
- 3.13 All asset realisations have now been concluded.
- 3.14 It is not anticipated that the work the Liquidators have carried out to deal with the Company's assets will provide a financial benefit to creditors. This is because the value of the assets was insufficient to produce a financial benefit after the associated costs of realisation were taken into consideration.

Creditors (claims and distributions)

- 3.15 The Liquidators are not only required to deal with correspondence and claims from unsecured creditors (which may include retention of title claims), but also those of any secured and preferential creditors of the Company. This may involve separate reporting to any secured creditor and dealing with distributions from asset realisations caught under their security, most typically a debenture.
- 3.16 Since 1 December 2020, claims from preferential creditors now fall into one of two categories, either ordinary (typically involving employee claims and payments made on behalf of the Company by the Redundancy Payments Service following dismissal, which rank equally among themselves), or secondary (which are claims by HMRC for VAT or other relevant tax deductions such as PAYE and employee NIC deductions, together with student loans and CIS deductions, which also rank equally among themselves). Ordinary preferential claims rank ahead of secondary preferential claims and all preferential creditors must be paid in full before any distribution can be made to the unsecured creditors of a company.
- 3.17 Work undertaken by the Liquidators in dealing with a company's creditors may only therefore bring a financial benefit to certain classes of creditor such as a secured creditor or the preferential creditors, however the Liquidators are required by statute to undertake this work. Similarly, if a distribution is to be paid to any class of creditor, work will be required to agree those claims and process the dividend payments to each relevant class of creditor. The more creditors a company has, the more time and cost will be involved by the Liquidators in dealing with those claims.
- 3.18 More information on the anticipated outcome for all classes of creditor in this case can be found in Section 4 below.

3.19 There are no new matters in respect of creditor claims.

Investigations

- 3.20 You may recall from my first progress report to creditors that some of the work the Liquidators are required to undertake is to comply with legislation such as the Company Directors' Disqualification Act 1986 (CDDA 1986) and Statement of Insolvency Practice 2 Investigations by Office Holders in Administration and Insolvent Liquidations and may not necessarily bring any financial benefit to creditors, unless these investigations reveal potential asset recoveries that the Liquidators can pursue for the benefit of creditors.
- 3.21 My report on the conduct of the Directors of the Company to the Department for Business, Energy & Industrial Strategy under the CDDA 1986 was submitted during the first year of the liquidation and is confidential.
- 3.22 The asset realisations that have come to light from my investigations are detailed in the realisation of assets section.

Matters still to be dealt with

3.23 Settle the outstanding costs of the Liquidation following which the Liquidation can be closed.

4 Creditors

Secured Creditors

4.1 There are no secured creditors.

4.3 There are insufficient funds to allow a dividend to be paid to the preferential creditors.

Unsecured Creditors

- The Company's statement of affairs indicated there were 8 creditors whose debts totalled £74,087.50. To date, I have received claims totalling £54,764.59 from 3 creditors.
- 4.5 No floating charges were granted to secured creditors by the Company. Accordingly, there is no requirement under s176A of the Insolvency Act 1986 to create a fund out of the Company's net floating charge property for unsecured creditors, known as the Prescribed Part.

4.6 Attached at Appendix D is an updated Estimated Outcome Statement for the liquidation. This represents my estimate of the outcome of the liquidation as at the end of the Period covered by this report. Further updates on the anticipated outcome to creditors will be provided in subsequent reports, however you will note that it is currently anticipated there will be insufficient funds realised after defraying the expenses of the liquidation to pay a dividend to unsecured creditors.

5 Joint Liquidators' Remuneration

- 5.1 Creditors approved that my unpaid pre-liquidation fees totalling £4,000 plus VAT and expenses be paid from the estate. These fees have now been paid in full.
- 5.2 The Creditors approved that the basis of the Liquidators' remuneration be fixed by reference to the time properly spent by them and their staff in managing the Liquidation. My fees estimate/information was originally provided to creditors when the basis of my remuneration was approved and was based on information available to me at that time.
- 5.3 A copy of my original fees estimate for the liquidation is attached at Appendix F.
- 5.4 My time costs for the Period are £12,053.50. This represents 41.05 hours at an average rate of £293.63 per hour. Attached as Appendix B is a time analysis which provides details of the activity costs incurred by staff grade during the Period in respect of the costs fixed by reference to time properly spent by me in managing the liquidation. To date, £18,000 plus expenses shown in the enclosed Receipts and Payments Account has been drawn on account.
- Also attached as Appendix C is a cumulative time analysis for the period from 1 March 2021 to 28 February 2023 which provides details of the time costs incurred since my appointment. The cumulative time costs incurred to date are £21,026.50. This represents 76.75 hours at an average rate of £273.96 per hour.
- At the date of this report, I would confirm that my fees estimate for the liquidation remains unchanged and I currently anticipate that the total amount that will be paid to my firm in respect of the time costs incurred will be £19,240. Where this amount is less than my overall fees estimate, it may be that my fee recoveries will be restricted as a result of the funds available in the liquidation, which will prevent my time costs being recovered in full.

- 5.8 Attached as Appendix E is additional information in relation to the Liquidators' fees and expenses, including where relevant, information on the use of subcontractors and professional advisers.

6 Creditors' Rights

- 6.1 Within 21 days of the receipt of this report, a secured creditor, or an unsecured creditor (with the concurrence of at least 5% in value of the unsecured creditors) may request in writing that the Liquidators provide further information about their remuneration or expenses which have been itemised in this progress report.
- 6.2 Any secured creditor, or an unsecured creditor (with the concurrence of at least 10% in value of the unsecured creditors) may within 8 weeks of receipt of this progress report make an application to court on the grounds that, in all the circumstances, the basis fixed for the Liquidators' remuneration is inappropriate and/or the remuneration charged or the expenses incurred by the Liquidators, as set out in this progress report, are excessive.

7 Next Report

- 7.1 I am required to provide a further report on the progress of the liquidation within two months of the next anniversary of the liquidation, unless I have concluded matters prior to this, in which case I will write to all creditors with my final account.
