#### **NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS**

#### for the year ended 31 December 2018

#### 1. GENERAL INFORMATION

Witteveen+Bos UK Limited ("the company") is a private limited company incorporated and domiciled in England and Wales, registration number 09484635. The address of its registered office is c/o Framework, 35 King Street, Bristol, England, BS1 4DZ.

#### 2. FUNCTIONAL AND PRESENTATION CURRENCY

These financial statements are presented in GBP, which is the functional currency of the company.

#### 3. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### Basis of preparing the financial statements

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with United Kingdom Accounting Standards, including Financial Reporting Standard 102 section 1A "The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland" ("FRS 102") and the Companies Act 2006, under the provision for Small Companies.

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

#### Going concern

The financial statements have been prepared on the going concern basis. The parent company has given an undertaking that it will continue to provide support to the company for the foreseeable future to enable the company to meet its debts as they fall due. The parent company has also confirmed that there is no intention to withdraw its support in the next twelve months.

#### Financial reporting standard 102 - reduced disclosure exemptions

The company has taken advantage of the following disclosure exemptions in preparing these financial statements, as permitted by FRS 102 "The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland":

- the requirements of Section 7 Statement of Cash Flows;
- the requirements of Sections 11 Financial Instruments paragraphs 11.39 to 11.48A

#### Turnover and expenses

Turnover represents net invoice value of services provided during the year, excluding Value Added Tax.

Expenses are included in the statement of comprehensive income on an accruals basis, net of discounts and value added tax.

#### **Operating leases**

Rentals paid under operating leases are charged to the profit and loss account on a straight line basis over the period of the lease.

## Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Computer equipment - 5 years Fixtures and fittings - 5 years

## Work in progress

Work in progress is valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

#### 3. ACCOUNTING POLICIES - continued

#### **Deferred** tax

Deferred tax is recognised in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed at the statement of financial position date.

Timing differences arise from the inclusion of income and expenses in tax assessments in periods different from those in which they are recognised in financial statements. Deferred tax is measured using tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the year end and that are expected to apply to the reversal of the timing difference.

Unrelieved tax losses and other deferred tax assets are recognised only to the extent that it is probable that they will be recovered against the reversal of deferred tax liabilities or other future taxable profits.

#### Foreign currencies

The functional and presentational currency of the company is Sterling. Assets and liabilities in foreign currencies are translated into sterling at the rates of exchange ruling at the statement of financial position date. Transactions in foreign currencies are translated into sterling at the rate of exchange ruling at the date of transaction. Exchange differences are taken into account in arriving at the operating result.

#### Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash in hand and monies held in bank current accounts.

#### Debtors and other receivables

Debtors and other receivables are measured at transaction price, less any impairment.

#### Creditors and other payables

Creditors and other payables are measured at historical cost. Accrued expenses are recognised when the amount can measured reliably.

#### Critical accounting judgements and key sources of estimation uncertainty

In the application of the company's accounting policies, the directors are required to make judgements, estimates and assumptions about the carrying amounts of assets and liabilities that are not readily apparent from other sources. The estimates and associated assumptions are based on historical experience and other factors that are considered to be relevant. Actual results

## Factors that may affect future tax charges

The UK corporation tax rate reduced to 19% from April 2017. The UK government announced a further reduction in the main rate of UK corporation tax to 17% from 1 April 2020. Where these reduced tax rates were enacted at the statement of financial position date, they have been reflected in these financial statements as appropriate.

In addition as part of the Finance Act 2017, the UK government has announced that restrictions on interest deductibility and loss relief will be implemented. Draft legislation has been released setting out the new provisions. This may impact the taxable profits of the company as well as the amount of carried-forward losses which can be utilised each year to offset taxable profits.
