This financial year 'Owdyado have been spent developing their fourth show "A View from the Edge" which began touring in January 2017.

'Owdyado predominately tour to rural communities, playing in local halls etc to provide theatre for those who live away from cities and cultural hubs. 'Owdyado also tour to educational establishments.

By touring to rural venues 'Owdyado provide opportunities for our audiences to overcome social isolation, bringing communities together by staging an event with a wide appeal in their local area.

We provide workshops in schools and colleges in order to share theatre skills with these generations. Workshops will either be offered alongside our shows or independently. Our workshops will give our audiences the potential to learn about artistic career opportunities as well as building self confidence and learning team-working skills.

We are part-funded by Arts Council England (ACE) on a project basis (under their *Grants for the Arts Scheme*) – A View from The Edge is one such project and we hope to continue our relationship with the Arts Council when developing future shows. Arts Council grants are released in stages. 'Owdyado provide interim reports to the Arts Council over the duration of the project that update them on how the project is progressing and include to-date spending. Once these interim reports are approved, the next section of grant money is released. Generally speaking, before we start a project, we try to meet with one of the south west reps from the Arts Council to go over the project including the budget. We act on the advice of the rep in terms before we put in a bid for the grant.

We are also a Resident Company of Hall For Comwall and receive advice and rehearsal space from them as part of this scheme. We have consultations from their Arts Development team when applying for funding and we acted on advice from Hall for Cornwall for A View from the Edge. (specifically, HFC helped us with our ACE bid – budgeting, help with business plan, and proof reading the text of the grant bid.)


