At Abbey Gymnastics CIC we provide professional gymnastics and gymnastics related fitness programmes with a participant centred approach. Our range of classes are open to children, young people and adults of all ages and abilities. Our coaches endeavour to instill discipline and team work while increasing each participants self-confidence and self-esteem while encouraging them to reach their full potential within the sport. Abbey Gymnastics CIC continue to provide an outlet for health related activities for all.

A priority of the programme is to engage the community of West Belfast and give opportunities through sport, health and fitness and coach education to those who have experienced long-standing levels of deprivation.

Abbey Gymnastics CIC now has 3 full time and 7 part time staff, both in a paid and voluntary capacity. During our 2013/2014 year 1 coach has achieved Level 1, 2 coaches achieve level 2 and 2 coaches achieve level 3 qualifications in the disciplines of GFA, Women's Artistic, Trampoline and TeamGym as well as 3 coaches achieving additional Judging qualifications in Trampolining.

To date the Club has mentored 6 coaches who achieved 200 hours service awards through Volunteer Now with one of our coaches being awarded the Ultimate Volunteer Award and now an ambassador for Volunteer Now Millennium Volunteering Programme.

2014 also seen recognition of our experienced coaching staff with Head Coach Alison McMullan receiving Belfast City Council Senior Coach of the Year and the Club being runner up in the Sports Facilities of the Year category. As well as finalist nominees; Hannah Morrison, Junior Sportsperson of the Year.

2 Members of the Club also represented their Country at International Events such as Junior Europeans, UK School Games and Celtic Cup.

During this year, Abbey have also provided activities through OFMDFM community development fund providing sports camp for 11-19year olds in local schools as well as our own self-funded Summer & Easter Camp programmes for members and non-members and 2 annual "In-House" competitions for our current members.

Abbey have once again provided gymnastics instruction to Belfast City Council "Try-Sport" days bi-monthly in local leisure facilities.

The Club is a real part of the community and is recognised as a safe and caring environment by British Gymnastics, Gymnastics Ireland, Sport Northern Ireland, Belfast City Council and Volunteer Now.
