- (2) Promote community development and the regeneration of local areas by occupying formerly empty premises/buildings and, where appropriate, preserving, maintaining and improving such facilities.

- We salvage disused buildings as affordable space for people to make art and support creativity.
- We foster engagement amongst our members to develop new ways of working and strengthen our impact as a collective.
- We provide an alternative independent platform for challenging and celebrating the arts.

Members

We provide affordable workspaces to our 101 artist members. Our membership includes artists from across a wide range of creative disciplines and practices at all stages of their careers. Our members include those that work as:

- Visual artists (including painters, sculptors, performance artists, sound artists, photographers, printmakers, craft makers, curators, street artists, textile artists, illustrators)
- Filmmakers (including directors, producers, writers, animators, motion graphic designers, actors)
- Community artists and facilitators
- Theatre makers (including actors, writers, directors, producers)
- Other performing artists (including circus, street performers, dancers, choreographers)
- Writers (including literature, graphic novels/comic artists)
- Musicians (including songwriters, singers, traditional musicians, bands, composers)

Room rentals

We provide short term rental opportunities of four spaces to arts professionals, community groups and individuals.

Uses of rented spaces include:

- Classes (dancing, health and wellbeing (yoga, pilates)
- Rehearsals (theatre, dance)
- Youth groups
- Partnerships with other local arts organisations such as EastSide Arts as a venue

Audiences

Building Improvements

Vault Artist Studios oversees an ongoing programme of maintenance and improvements to our building.

In March 2019 we began a 2 month project to improve the visual aesthetic of the facade of our building. Members of Vault Artist Studios worked together on a massive repaint and mural project. Our brief was to remain sensitive to the 1960's architecture of the site, to make the building more visually welcoming and to showcase the work of our members.

Alongside this facade renovation, we created an outreach project and invited anyone who had worked, studied or taught at the site during it's time as a college to contribute stories and pictures of their time here. These pictures were then enlarged and pasted into the windows and along the east theatre wall of our building. The launch of this project coincided with our Vault Fringe Festival in June 2019

Other improvements included:

- May 2019 Newly renovated members room opens.
- June 2019 Our manifesto is created by members is installed in the lobby.
- March June 2019 Extensive work within the building was required to gain an Entertainments
 Licence including Electrical Certification, Emergency Lighting upgrades and structural
 certification
- June 2019 Members of Vault and guest artists added murals to the west wing exterior of our building.
- October 2019 We installed a new map and signposting area in our lobby.
- November 2019 Heating installed in our members room

Created paid roles and work opportunities for our members.

Our Fringe Festival 2019 and second Christmas Market 2019 provided an opportunity for us to create paid roles for our members working on producing events. These include design, administration, production, programming, stewarding, and performance

Events programme

The Fringe Festival and Belfast Open Studios events provided benefits to members by providing them with opportunities to showcase their work, leading in turn to further opportunities to sustain and enhance their career. The public were benefited by the opportunity to engage with the vibrant and exciting newly established studio group and explore its new home in Tower Street.

The Christmas Arts Market benefited the members by creating job roles, providing them the opportunity to sell their work and garner commissions and be paid to perform by an eager public who mutually benefited from the opportunity to buy high quality art works and experience the unique atmosphere of Vault.

'The Faculty' and 'Make Tower Street Teach Again' workshop programmes benefited the members by providing them with the opportunity to teach workshops in their artistic disciplines. It benefitted members of the public by allowing them to learn new artistic skills and techniques in a former educational building. The wider public benefited from the cultural provision demonstrated by the audience engagement.

The Vault Facade and outreach programme benefitted members and current Tower Street residents as it gave many an opportunity to showcase their work on the exterior of the building. It benefitted former staff, students and teachers as they were able to take part in the outreach aspect of the project. It benefited our local neighbours by renovating the exterior facade of the building and improving the visual aspect of the site and the street.

Restrictions on who can benefit

There are restrictions on who can join as a member. The following criteria are used to assess new applications

- Ensure we represent a diverse range of artforms
- Ensure we maintain a good gender balance
- Ensure our members have an active artistic practice
- Priority is given to members that are based in Belfast

People that make use of our room rentals must ensure they have adequate public liability insurance. There are no restrictions on those that can benefit as audiences and participants at events.

Harm

There is no harm arising from any of our purposes.

Private Benefit

Vault Artist Studios trustees have exhibited their work in our internal gallery but did so as members under the guidance of a non-trustee curator. Trustees availed of studio space but this is necessary as studio members must be represented on the Board of Trustees and is incidental as Trustees applied for and were assigned studio space in the same way as all other beneficiaries We have not undertaken any maintenance to the building that was not essential for us to carry out normal operations and so the only private benefit to the building owners was incidental.

1. General information

The charity is a public benefit entity and a private company limited by guarantee, registered in Northern Ireland and a registered charity in Northern Ireland. The address of the registered office is 35 Mountcollyer Avenue, Belfast, BT15 3DQ.

2. Statement of compliance

These financial statements have been prepared in compliance with FRS 102, 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and the Republic of Ireland', the Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (Charities SORP (FRS 102)) and the Companies Act 2006.

3. Accounting policies

Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared on the historical cost basis, as modified by the revaluation of certain financial assets and liabilities and investment properties measured at fair value through income or expenditure.

The financial statements are prepared in sterling, which is the functional currency of the entity.

Going concern

There are no material uncertainties about the charity's ability to continue.

Judgements and key sources of estimation uncertainty

The preparation of the financial statements requires management to make judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the amounts reported. These estimates and judgements are continually reviewed and are based on experience and other factors, including expectations of future events that are believed to be reasonable under the circumstances.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds are available for use at the discretion of the trustees to further any of the charity's purposes.

Designated funds are unrestricted funds earmarked by the trustees for particular future project or commitment.

Restricted funds are subjected to restrictions on their expenditure declared by the donor or through the terms of an appeal, and fall into one of two sub-classes: restricted income funds or endowment funds.

3. Accounting policies (continued)

Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included in the statement of financial activities when entitlement has passed to the charity; it is probable that the economic benefits associated with the transaction will flow to the charity and the amount can be reliably measured. The following specific policies are applied to particular categories of income:

- income from donations or grants is recognised when there is evidence of entitlement to the gift, receipt is probable and its amount can be measured reliably.
- legacy income is recognised when receipt is probable and entitlement is established.
- income from donated goods is measured at the fair value of the goods unless this is impractical to measure reliably, in which case the value is derived from the cost to the donor or the estimated resale value. Donated facilities and services are recognised in the accounts when received if the value can be reliably measured. No amounts are included for the contribution of general volunteers.
- income from contracts for the supply of services is recognised with the delivery of the contracted service. This is classified as unrestricted funds unless there is a contractual requirement for it to be spent on a particular purpose and returned if unspent, in which case it may be regarded as restricted.

Resources expended

Expenditure is recognised on an accruals basis as a liability is incurred. Expenditure includes any VAT which cannot be fully recovered, and is classified under headings of the statement of financial activities to which it relates:

- expenditure on raising funds includes the costs of all fundraising activities, events, non-charitable trading activities, and the sale of donated goods.
- expenditure on charitable activities includes all costs incurred by a charity in undertaking activities that further its charitable aims for the benefit of its beneficiaries, including those support costs and costs relating to the governance of the charity apportioned to charitable activities.
- other expenditure includes all expenditure that is neither related to raising funds for the charity nor part of its expenditure on charitable activities.

All costs are allocated to expenditure categories reflecting the use of the resource. Direct costs attributable to a single activity are allocated directly to that activity. Shared costs are apportioned between the activities they contribute to on a reasonable, justifiable and consistent basis.

Tangible assets

Tangible assets are initially recorded at cost, and subsequently stated at cost less any accumulated depreciation and impairment losses. Any tangible assets carried at revalued amounts are recorded at the fair value at the date of revaluation less any subsequent accumulated depreciation and subsequent accumulated impairment losses.

Tangible assets (continued)

An increase in the carrying amount of an asset as a result of a revaluation, is recognised in other recognised gains and losses, unless it reverses a charge for impairment that has previously been recognised as expenditure within the statement of financial activities. A decrease in the carrying amount of an asset as a result of revaluation, is recognised in other recognised gains and losses, except to which it offsets any previous revaluation gain, in which case the loss is shown within other recognised gains and losses on the statement of financial activities.

Depreciation

Depreciation is calculated so as to write off the cost or valuation of an asset, less its residual value, over the useful economic life of that asset as follows:

Plant and machinery - 25% straight line
Fixtures and fittings - 20% straight line
Equipment - 25% straight line

4. Limited by guarantee

The liability of the members is limited.

Every member of the Charity promises, if the Charity is dissolved while he, she or it is a member or within twelve months after he, she or it ceases to be a member, to contribute such sum (not exceeding £1) as may be demanded of him, her or it towards the payment of the debts and liabilities of the Charity incurred before he, she or it ceases to be a member, and of the costs, charges and expenses of winding up, and the adjustment of the rights of the contributories among themselves.
