#### Policy on members' drawings

The members' drawing policy allows each member to draw a proportion of their profit share, subject to the cash requirements of the business.

A member's capital requirement is linked to their share of profit and the financing requirement of the limited liability partnership. There is no opportunity for appreciation of the capital subscribed. Just as incoming members introduce their capital at "par", so the retiring members are repaid their capital at "par". During the year members' capital was reclassified as a liability under FRS 25 'Financial Instruments: disclosure and presentation'. The prior year has been restated for comparability.

#### Statement of members' responsibilities

Company law (as applied to limited liability partnerships by regulation 3 of the Limited Liability Partnerships Regulations 2001) requires the members to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the limited liability partnership and of the profit or loss of the limited liability partnership for that year. ## INDEPENDENT AUDITORS' REPORT TO THE MEMBERS OF MANCHES LLP

We have audited the financial statements of Manches LLP for the year ended 31 December 2005 which comprise the Profit and Loss Account, the Statement of Total Recognised Gains and Losses, the Balance Sheet, the Cash Flow Statement and Cash Flow Notes, and related Notes to the Financial Statements 1 to 21. These financial statements have been prepared under the accounting policies set out therein.

#### NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2005

#### 1 Accounting policies

#### 1.1 Accounting convention

A summary of the principal accounting policies, all of which have been applied consistently throughout the year and, except for changes noted below, the preceding year, is set out below.

#### 1.2 Compliance with accounting standards

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with applicable United Kingdom accounting standards including the Statement of Recommended Accounting Practice, Accounting by Limited Liability Partnerships (March 2006), and under the historical cost convention.

For the first time the Limited Liability Partnership has adopted Urgent Issues Task Force (UITF) Abstract 40 "Revenue recognition and service contracts" and FRS 25 "Financial instruments: disclosure and presentation". This gives rise to prior year adjustments and the restatement of the financial statements for the previous year. The effects of these changes are detailed in note 2.

#### 1.3 Turnover

Turnover represents amounts receivable for goods and services net of VAT and trade discounts.

In accordance with UITF 40, profit is recognised on contracts if the final outcome can be assessed with reasonable certainty, by including in the profit and loss account turnover and related costs as contract activity progresses. This amounts to a change in accounting policy. Please see note 2 for further details.

#### 1.4 Goodwill

Acquired goodwill is written off in equal annual instalments over four years, being its estimated useful economic life.

#### 1.5 Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less depreciation. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost less estimated residual value of each asset over its expected useful life, as follows:

Leasehold improvements
Computers and office equipment
Fixtures and fittings
Motor vehicles

over 3 or 10 years straight line over 3 or 5 years straight line over 3 or 10 years straight line over the period of the lease

#### 1.6 Leasing

Assets obtained under hire purchase contracts and finance leases are capitalised as tangible assets and depreciated over the shorter of the lease term and their useful lives. Obligations under such agreements are included in creditors net of the finance charge allocated to future periods. The finance element of the rental payment is charged to the profit and loss account so as to produce a constant periodic rate of charge on the net obligation outstanding in each period.

Rentals payable under operating leases are charged against income on a straight line basis over the lease term.

#### 1.7 Investments

Fixed asset investments are stated at cost less provision for diminution in value.

#### 1.8 Work in progress

Work in progress is valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

#### 1 Accounting policies

(continued)

#### 1.9 Pensions

The limited liability partnership operates a defined contribution scheme for the benefit of its employees. Contributions payable are charged to the profit and loss account in the year they are payable.

#### 1.10 Members' remuneration

Members' remuneration is charged as an expense in the profit and loss account as each member has an entitlement to a share of future profit without the need for any further decision by the members on the division of those profits. This amounts to a change in accounting policy. Please see note 2 for further details.

#### 1.11 Members' capital

Amounts subscribed or otherwise contributed by members are classified as capital by the limited liability partnership deed. Members capital is classified as a liability under FRS 25 "Financial Instruments: disclosure and presentation" as the capital is repayable to members on their retirement. This amounts to a change in accounting policy. Please see note 2 for further details.

#### 2 Prior year adjustment

The limited liability partnership has adopted for the first time FRS 25 "Financial instruments: disclosure and presentation", and UITF 40 "Revenue recognition and service contracts". This gives rise to prior year adjustments and the restatement of the previous year's financial statements. The effect of these changes on the limited liability partnership's members' interests is shown below.

The adoption of FRS 25 has resulted in the limited liability partnership reporting nil net assets as all members' interests have been reclassified as liabilities. Members' capital at 31 December 2004 of £2,191,000 has been transferred to Loans and other debts due to members. In addition, members' remuneration has been charged as an expense shown on the face of the profit and loss account to reflect the automatic allocation of profits.

#### 3 Turnover

The total turnover of the limited liability partnership for the year has been derived from its principal activity wholly undertaken in the United Kingdom.
