1. GENERAL INFORMATION

A & H Partnership LLP is a limited liability partnership set up in England on 25 August 2004. Its main activity is asset holding. Its registered office is Gladstone House, 77-79 High Street, Egham, Surrey, England, TW20 9HY.

2. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The principal accounting policies adopted in the preparation of these financial statements, which have been applied consistently, are set out below:

(a) Basis of preparation

The financial statements of A & H Partnership LLP are those of the Partnership only (i.e. the separate financial statements). These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with International Financial Reporting Standards (IFRS).

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention, as modified by the revaluation of investments.

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with IFRS requires the members to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosures of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amount of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Although these estimates are based on management's best knowledge of current events and actions, actual results may ultimately differ from these estimates.

(b) Critical accounting estimates and judgements in applying accounting policies

The Partnership makes estimates and judgements that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities within the next year. Estimates and judgements are continually evaluated and are based on historical experience and other factors, including expectations future events that are believed to be reasonable under the circumstances.

There are no significant estimates or judgements made by the Partnership for the financial year ended 31 March 2008.

(c) Standards, amendment and interpretations effective in 2007

IFRS 7, 'Financial instruments: Disclosures', and the complementary amendment to IAS 1, 'Presentation of financial statements – Capital disclosures', introduces new disclosures relating to financial instruments and does not have any impact on the classification and the valuation of the Partnership's financial instruments, or the disclosures relating to trade and other receivables, and trade and other payables.

2. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONT'D)

(d) Standards, amendments and interpretations effective in 2007 but not relevant for the Partnership's operations

The following standards, amendments and interpretations to published standards are mandatory for accounting periods beginning on or after 1 January 2007 but they are not relevant to the Partnership's operations:

- IFRIC 8, 'Scope of IFRS 2',
- IFRIC 10, 'Interim financial reporting and impairment',
- IFRIC 11, 'IFRS 2 Group and treasury share transactions',
- IFRS 4, 'Insurance contracts',
- IFRIC 7, 'Applying the restatement approach under IAS 29, Financial reporting in hyperinflationary economies'; and
- IFRIC 9, 'Re-assessment of embedded derivatives'.

(e) Standards, amendments and interpretations to existing standards that are not yet effective and have not been early adopted by the Partnership

The following standards, amendments and interpretations to existing standards have been published and are mandatory for the Partnership's accounting periods beginning on or after 1 January 2008 or later periods, but the Partnership has not early adopted them:

IAS 23 (Amendment), 'Borrowing costs' (effective from 1 January 2009). It requires an entity to capitalise borrowing costs directly attributable to the acquisition, construction or production of a qualifying asset (one that takes a substantial period of time to get ready for use or sale) as part of the cost of that asset. The option of immediately expensing those borrowing costs will be removed. The Partnership will apply IAS 23 (Amended) from 1 April 2009 but is currently not applicable to the Partnership as there are no qualifying assets.

(f) Interpretations to existing standards that are not yet effective and not relevant for the Partnership's operations

The following interpretations to existing standards have been published and are mandatory for the Partnership's accounting periods beginning on or after 1 January 2008 or later periods but are not relevant for the Partnership's operations:

- IFRS 8, 'Operating segments' (effective from 1 January 2009),
- IFRIC 14, 'IAS 19 The limit on a defined benefit asset, minimum funding requirements and their interaction' (effective from 1 January 2008),

2. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONT'D)

(f) Interpretations to existing standards that are not yet effective and not relevant for the Partnership's operations (cont'd)

- IFRIC 12, 'Service concession arrangements' (effective from 1 January 2008), and
- IFRIC 13, 'Customer loyalty programmes' (effective from 1 July 2008).

(g) Financial instruments

Financial instruments carried on the balance sheet include financial assets and liabilities at fair value through profit or loss (FVTPL), loans receivable, trade and other receivables, cash and cash equivalents, loans payables and trade and other payables.

(i) Financial assets at Fair Value through Profit or Loss (FVTPL)

Financial assets are classified as at FVTPL where the financial asset is either held for trading or it is designated as at FVTPL.

A financial asset is classified as held for trading if:

- it has been acquired principally for the purpose of selling in the near future; or
- it is a part of an identified portfolio of financial instruments that the Partnership manages together and has a recent actual pattern of short-term profit-taking; or
- it is a derivative that is not designated and effective as a hedging instrument.

A financial asset other than a financial asset held for trading may be designated as at FVTPL upon initial recognition if:

- such designation eliminates or significantly reduces a measurement or recognition inconsistency that would otherwise arise; or
- the financial asset forms part of a group of financial assets or financial liabilities or both, which is managed and its performance is evaluated on a fair value basis, in accordance with the Partnership's documented risk management or investment strategy, and information about the grouping is provided internally on that basis; or
- it forms part of a contract containing one or more embedded derivatives, and IAS 39 permits the entire combined contract (asset or liability) to be designated as at FVTPL.

Financial assets at FVTPL are stated at fair value, with any resultant gain or loss recognised in profit or loss.

2. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONT'D)

(g) Financial instruments (cont'd)

(ii) Loans and receivables

Loans and receivables are stated at their nominal value.

(iii) Trade and other payables

Trade and other payables are stated at their nominal value.

(iv) Cash and cash equivalents

Cash is defined as cash on hand and cash in banks and investments in money market instruments, net of outstanding bank overdrafts.

(h) Foreign currencies

(i) Functional and presentation currency

The financial statements are presented in United States Dollars, which is the Partnership's functional and presentation currency.

(ii) Transactions and balances

Foreign currency transactions are translated into United States Dollars using the exchange rates prevailing on the dates of the transactions. Foreign exchange gains and losses resulting from the settlement of such transactions as from the translation at year-end exchange rates of monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies are recognised in the income statement.

Non-monetary items that are measured at historical cost in a foreign currency are translated using the exchange rate at the date of the transaction.

Non-monetary items that are measured at fair value in a foreign currency are translated using the exchange rates at the date the fair value was determined.

2. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONT'D)

(i) Revenue recognition

Dividend is recognised when the Partnership's right to receive payment is established.

Interest receivable and investment income are recognised on an accrual basis, unless collectibility is in doubt.

(j) Provisions

Provisions are recognised when: the Partnership has a present legal or constructive obligation as a result of past events; it is probable that an outflow of resources that can be reliably estimated will be required to settle the obligation.

(k) Related parties

Related parties are individuals and entities where the individual or entity has the ability, directly or indirectly, to control the other party or exercise significant influence over the other party in making financial and operating decisions.

3. FINANCIAL RISK MANAGEMENT

3.1 Financial risk factors

The Partnership's activities expose it to a variety of financial risks including currency risk, market risk and liquidity risk.

Foreign currency risk

The Partnership has assets in currencies other than the US Dollars, its reporting currency. The Partnership is exposed to foreign exchange risk arising due to fluctuations of the US Dollar vis-à-vis the Pound Sterling.

Market risk

The Partnership's activities expose it to market risk, that is the risk that the value of the investment will fluctuate as a result of changes in market prices.

Liquidity risk

Prudent liquidity risk management implies maintaining sufficient cash and marketable securities and the availability of funding through an adequate amount of committed credit facilities.
