MEMBERS' REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2016

The member, present their annual report together with the audited financial statements of Absolute Energy Capital LLP (the "LLP") for the year ended 31 March 2016.

The loss for the year to be allocated to members was £569 (2015: £10,062).

Principal activities

The principal activity of the LLP is that of providing investment advisory services. The LLP is currently not trading but is seeking opportunities for further advisory work.

Policies with respect to members' drawings, subscriptions and repayment of amounts subscribed or otherwise contributed

Policies for members' drawings, subscriptions and repayment of members' capital are governed by a partnership agreement dated 23 March 2009, as amended and restated on 1 June 2009.

Going Concern

The LLP remains inactive but continues to incur costs and to maintain its FCA authorisation. These costs are predictable and the members' plan for the period of one year from the date of signature of the accounts allows for similar expenditure to the year under review. The LLP has certain income from management charges and a retainer paid by an Appointed Representative. Members will ensure, through their control of Absolute Energy Srl, as explained in note 14 to the financial statements, that the LLP will have sufficient capital to meets its capital requirement under FCA rules. In the circumstances the members consider it is appropriate for the LLP to draw up its accounts on a going concern basis.

Disclosure of information to the auditor

Each member, at the time this members' report is approved has confirmed that:

- so far as they are aware, there is no relevant audit information of which the LLP's auditor is unaware, and
- they have taken all the steps that they ought to have taken as a member in order to be aware of any relevant audit information and to establish that the LLP's auditor is aware of that information.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2016

1. General information

These financial statements are presented in Pounds Sterling (GBP).

The principal activity of the LLP during the year was to provide investment advisory services.

The address of its registered office is 100 Pall Mall, London, SW1Y 5NQ.

2. Summary of significant accounting policies

2.1 Basis of preparation of financial statements

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with Financial Reporting Standard 102, the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the United Kingdom and the Republic of Ireland and the Companies Act 2006 and the requirements of the Statement of Recommended Practice "Accounting by Limited Liability Partnerships".

Information on the impact of first-time adoption of FRS 102 is given in note 15.

The preparation of financial statements in compliance with FRS 102 requires the use of certain critical accounting estimates. It also requires management to exercise judgement in applying the LLP's accounting policies (see note 3).

The following principal accounting policies have been applied:

2.2 Revenue

Revenue shown in the profit and loss account represents investment advisory services arising from continuing activities in the United Kingdom and is stated on an accruals basis, exclusive of Value Added Tax.

2.3 Operating leases

Rentals paid under operating leases are charged to the profit or loss on a straight line basis over the period of the lease.

2.4 Members' participation rights

Each member's capital account includes the amounts initially contributed by the member to the LLP. Profits are divided only after a decision by the LLP, so that the LLP has an unconditional right to refuse payment. Such profits are classed as an appropriation of equity rather than as an expense. They are therefore shown as a residual amount available for discretionary division among members in the statement of comprehensive income and are equity appropriations in the SOCE.

2.5 Debtors

Short term debtors are measured at transaction price, less any impairment. Loans receivable are measured initially at fair value, net of transaction costs, and are measured subsequently at amortised cost using the effective interest method, less any impairment.

2. Summary of significant accounting policies (continued)

2.6 Cash and cash equivalents

Cash is represented by cash in hand and deposits with financial institutions repayable without penalty on notice of not more than 24 hours. Cash equivalents are highly liquid investments that mature in no more than three months from the date of acquisition and that are readily convertible to known amounts of cash with insignificant risk of change in value.

2.7 Financial instruments

The LLP only enters into basic financial instruments transactions that result in the recognition of financial assets and liabilities such as trade and other accounts receivable and payable, loans from banks and other third parties, loans to related parties.

2.8 Creditors

Short term creditors are measured at transaction price. Other financial liabilities, including bank loans, are measured initially at fair value, net of transaction costs, and are measured subsequently at amortised cost using the effective interest method.

2.9 Foreign currency translation

Functional and presentation currency

The company's functional and presentational currency is GBP.

Transactions and balances

Foreign currency transactions are translated into the functional currency using the spot exchange rates at the dates of the transactions.

At each period end, foreign currency monetary items are translated using the closing rate. Non-monetary items measured at historical cost are translated using the exchange rate at the date of the transaction and non-monetary items measured at fair value are measured using the exchange rate when fair value was determined.

2.10 Interest income

Interest income is recognised in the statement of comprehensive income using the effective interest method.

3. Judgements in applying accounting policies and key sources of estimation uncertainty

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to make estimates and assumptions which affect reported income, expenses, assets and liabilities. Use of available information and application of judgement are inherent in the formation of estimates, together with past experience and expectations of future events that are believed to be reasonable under the circumstances. Actual results in the future could differ from such estimates.

The designated members consider that because of the simple nature of the LLP'S operations, the financial statements are not subject to significant estimation uncertainty.

14. Related party transactions

Absolute Energy SrI is an Italian company, trading in Italy with similar activities to the LLP. It is controlled by the designated members of the LLP.

During the year, Absolute Energy Srl was invoiced by the LLP for management charges amounting to £26,966 (2015: £20,873).

Also during the year interest was charged by the LLP to Absolute Energy Srl amounting to £9 (2015: £39).

As at 31 March 2016, Absolute Energy Srl owed the LLP £790 (2015: £13,405).

The LLP owed £10,000 (2015: £nil) to Absolute Energy Srl as at 31 March 2016.

As at 31 March 2016, included in trade creditors is amount of £5,707 payable to Alberto Pisanti for travel expenses.

15. First time adoption of FRS 102

The policies applied under the LLP's previous accounting framework were not materially different from those now applied under FRS 102 and hence the adoption of FRS102 has not impacted on equity or profit or loss.
