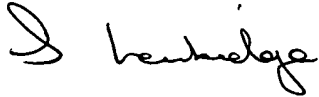

8. The eighth part of the document discusses the importance of the auditor's adherence to the applicable standards. It states that the auditor must follow the standards set forth by the relevant professional body and must not deviate from those standards in any way.

9. The ninth part of the document discusses the importance of the auditor's ongoing education and training. It states that the auditor must keep up-to-date with the latest developments in the field of auditing and must participate in ongoing education and training programs.

10. The tenth part of the document discusses the importance of the auditor's ethical conduct. It states that the auditor must adhere to the highest standards of ethical conduct and must not engage in any behavior that would reflect unfavorably on the profession.
