Report of the Directors

The directors present the accounts for the year ended 29 February 2004 and the auditors' report thereon.

Result for the year

The surplus before donations on the luncheon held at the Kelvingrove Art Gallery and Museum was £216,180 (2003 - £133,305 surplus). During the year the directors made donations to Scottish Charities of £210,000 (2002 - £130,000). The surplus after donations was £6,180 (2003 - £3,305). The directors are not authorised to declare dividends.

Activities

The company is engaged in fund-raising for charitable purposes at the annual Scottish Business Achievement Award Lunch. The company is a charitable trust limited by guarantee and registered as a Charity (number SC006586) with the Inland Revenue.

The guidelines that the company has adopted for the selection of charities are clearly defined. The organisation must be registered as a charity with the Inland Revenue; it must be registered as a charity and not a grant-making trust; the charity should be based in Scotland and run for the benefit of disabled or disadvantaged persons in Scotland.

INDEPENDENT AUDITORS' REPORT TO THE MEMBERS OF THE SCOTTISH BUSINESS ACHIEVEMENT AWARD TRUST

We have audited the accounts of the Scottish Business Achievement Award Trust Limited for the year ended 29 February 2004 which comprise the statement of financial activities (including the income and expenditure account), the balance sheet, and the related notes 1 to 9. These accounts have been prepared under the accounting policies set out therein.
