## Report of the Directors

The directors present the accounts for the year ended 29 February 2000 and the auditors' report thereon.

### Result for the year

The deficit on the 1999 lunch held at the Scottish Vintage Bus Museum, Lathalmond was £671 (1998 - £4,141 surplus). During the year the directors made donations to Scottish Charities of £405,000. The directors are not authorised to declare dividends.

#### **Activities**

The company is engaged in fund-raising for charitable purposes at the annual Scottish Business Achievement Award Lunch. The company is a charitable trust limited by guarantee and registered as a Charity (number SC006586) with Inland Revenue Claims Scotland.

The guidelines that the committee has adopted for the selection of charities are clearly defined. The organisation must be registered as a charity with the Inland Revenue; it must be registered as a charity and not a grant-making trust; the charity should be based in Scotland and run for the benefit of disabled and/or disadvantaged persons in Scotland.
