#### TRUSTEES ANNUAL REPORT

#### YEAR ENDED 30th SEPTEMBER 2007

The trustees, who are also Directors for the purposes of the Companies Act, have pleasure in presenting their report and the unaudited financial statements of the charity for the year ended 30th September 2007

#### INTRODUCTION

Enterprise Music Scotland Limited aims to represent and support the work of music clubs, arts guilds and other bodies with similar interests. The main source of income is the Scotlish Arts Council. The company in turn makes grants to music societies and groups throughout Scotland with the aim of encouraging concerts and recitals of music.

#### **LEGAL STATUS**

Enterprise Music Scotland Limited is a company registered in Scotland and Limited by Guarantee It was established in 1992 Enterprise Music Scotland Limited is also a registered charity

#### **OBJECTIVES**

The objective and principal activity of the company is to advance the education of the public in, and to stimulate the performance and knowledge of live music in Scotland. The company helps to fund the performances of various kinds of music but it is principally involved in classical music.

#### **ORGANISATION**

The organisation is headed up by a Board of Directors. The membership of the organisation is made up from organisations dedicated to the promotion of music in Scotland and individuals or organisations who are invited by the directors to become members in the furtherance of the organisation's objectives. Representative directors are nominated by the member organisations and co opted directors are nominated by the Board. In addition to regular meetings of the whole Board of Trustees there are six sub-committees of Board members which meet to run specific activities of the organisation's work.

#### **FINANCIAL CONTROLS**

The finances of the organisation are controlled by the Executive Committee consisting of four members of the Board and monthly management accounts are maintained and presented at every Board meeting. The Board continues to monitor possible risks facing the company and has procedures to manage them. The Board has retained sufficient financial reserves to enable the short term continuation of activities, or an organised run down of activities, should our main source of funding be withdrawn unexpectedly.

## REVIEW OF DEVELOPMENTS, ACTIVITIES AND ACHIEVEMENTS

In season 2006/2007, 67 music clubs were supported (66 in 2005/2006) 404 concerts were promoted (376 in 2005/2006) with a total audience attendance of 42,680 (39,372 in 2005/06) Education workshops were supported in primary and secondary schools throughout Scotland The publication of the Scottish Tours Book provided the single shop window and main communication channel for artists to promote their ensembles to the music clubs in Scotland

The Scottish Tours Planning Conference provided the means for music clubs to consider, discuss and arrange tours for ensembles to optimise both knowledge of quality and the economics of fees and touring costs. A Showcase recital was given by students from the RSAMD as part of the Scottish Tours Conference.

The committees of the Board continued their work. The Funding Committee continued with the new reporting questions in the grant application process to focus clubs more clearly on the wider aims of promoting and developing professional live music throughout Scotland The Development Committee continued, with the aid of an external editor, to publish two issues of the newsletter and continue the development of the website including a full concert diary of events promoted The Residencies Project embarked on a pilot year during which the Alba string quartet received coaching from William Conway and worked with composer Kenneth Dempsey on the performance of one his pieces for inclusion in their concert programmes. The Board has updated the policy on Child Protection and established an Equal Opportunities Policy and written a Business Plan EMS is represented on the Chamber Music Forum initiated by the Scottish Arts Council and also attended Audience Development events EMS has been represented at all events organised by the Scottish Arts Council regarding Flexible Funding and Quality Framework

In January 2007 the Board appointed Miss Helen McVey to the part time post of Development Officer Helen serves on the organising committee of the Chamber Music Forum

The December 2006 Board meeting was given over to Board Development and addressed governance and aims and objectives and provided an induction opportunity for new members appointed at the Annual General Meeting Roy Alexander was elected as Company Secretary with no remuneration. The Executive Committee met four times in the period as did the full board

#### **RESULTS**

#### YEAR ENDED 30th SEPTEMBER 2007

#### 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with applicable United Kingdom accounting standards, the Statement of Recommended Practice "Accounting and Reporting by Charities" issued in March 2005 (SORP 2005) and the Companies Act 1985

The financial statements are prepared on the accruals basis. All expenditure relating to the year has been included in the accounts inclusive of value added tax.

#### Cash flow statement

The trustees have taken advantage of the exemption in Financial Reporting Standard No 1 (revised) from including a cash flow statement in the financial statements on the grounds that the charity is small

#### Depreciation

Depreciation is calculated so as to write off the cost of an asset over the useful economic life of that asset as follows

#### 4 years straight line

## Operating lease agreements

Rentals applicable to operating leases where substantially all of the benefits and risks of ownership remain with the lessor are charged against income on a straight line basis over the period of the lease

#### Pension costs

The charity operates a defined contribution pension scheme for employees. The assets of the scheme are held separately from those of the charity. The annual contributions payable are charged to the statement of financial activities.

#### **Grants provided**

Grants distributed to musical societies are recorded as they are paid, or as they fall due to be paid. Grants falling due but unpaid at the year end are held within creditors in the accounts

#### **Grants received**

Grants of a revenue nature are credited to the income and expenditure account on an accruals basis

#### Income from the Scottish Tours Book

Income relating to the Scottish Tours book is included in revenue in the period in which the book is published

#### 1 ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

#### Resources expended

Expenditure is recognised on an accruals basis as a liability is incurred. Expenditure includes any VAT which cannot be recovered and is reported as part of the expenditure to which it relates. Charitable expenditure comprises those costs incurred by the charity in the delivery of its activities and services for its beneficiaries. It includes both costs that can be allocated directly to those activities and those costs of an indirect nature necessary to support them. Governance costs include those costs associated with meeting the constitutional and statutory requirements of the charity.
