Report of the Directors for the Year Ended 31 March 2003

The directors are pleased to present their report together with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 March 2003.

Constitution

The Buddies Club and Playscheme (Glasgow West) ("the charity") is a company limited by guarantee (No. SC163352) and a recognised Scottish charity (No. SC024503), governed by its Memorandum and Articles of Association.

Principal Activity and Charitable Objectives

The principal activity of the charity in the year under review was:

the provision of communities based play/leisure and recreational opportunities for a range of children and young people with disabilities and additional needs thereby giving independence, choice and opportunity to be valued as individuals, thus allowing children and families to lead as normal lives as possible.

Administrative Structure

The directors are responsible for the overall direction of the charity. The daily administration is undertaken by the Development Manager and support staff.

The charity operates from within the Netherton Community Centre at 358 Netherton Road, Anniesland, Glasgow G13 1AX

Directors are elected at the Annual General Meeting, the board having the power to co-opt during the year, but all such persons may resign and stand for election at the next Annual General Meeting. In addition, one third of the directors must retire each year, but they may offer themselves for re-election. No paid employee may be a director.

Review of Activities

It has been a busy and exciting year with Buddies becoming well settled in Netherton Community Centre. The major benefits of secure premises have enabled us to expand our range of services.

Parent & Toddler Family Support

The project now runs four mornings per week and some (30 families) have benefited and use the facility. We have been extremely lucky to work in partnership with Kate Docherty (Health Visitor) and Ann-Marie Burns (Nursery Nurse), from the Riverside LHCC. This has enabled us to run 'Positive Parenting' courses and a Play and Share project. We have also had visits from oral health hygiene, a dietician and others. Our sincere thanks goes to Marion Hodgson, Childcare Strategy Manager for her vision and accessing Sure Start funding for the project.

Review of Activities (continued)

Afterschool Services

Our afterschool service continues to grow and we have a children's group, a junior teens and senior teens group on different days. However, even with our good premises, our wait list grows and the levels of need increase.

The size of our premises and funding means we cannot unfortunately meet the needs of everyone, but those who come have much enjoyment and make friendships in a happy, warm and friendly environment.

Holiday Playschemes

Our holiday playschemes now take some 50 children/teens on a daily basis with often up to 30 staff per day to meet the individual needs of those who come. Some 140 families now benefit from this service. The Parent & Toddler group also access 3 days from 11am-2pm while the others are out on a trip.

Youth Club

A new Youth Club on Monday evenings gives the older teens a club of their own for the first time. We would love to expand this service in the future.

Sunday Club

Our Sunday Club, which was the catalyst for starting Buddies, is much used and again we have different age groups and needs being addressed with a range of indoor and outdoor activities.

The key to all our services and the children's/teens enjoyment is of course our excellent staff, whose enthusiasm care and help make everything we do work well. Considerable effort has been made to ensure adequate staff training and relevant qualifications are obtained. Our sincere thanks to them all.

The sudden death of Bill Hook last August has been not only an immense personal loss but has had a significant impact on our activities. Bill was not only a founder of Buddies but his skill as a fundraiser will be impossible to follow. Sincere thanks to everyone who has offered help at this time

Finally, without the continued support and funding from Glasgow City Council Childcare Partnership, our work would not be possible. Play and leisure is something that is vital to all children's development and we hope we can continue to ensure that as many young people as possible can have the fun and pleasure our services offer.

The results for the accounting year and the financial position of the charity are shown in the attached financial statements.

Supporters, Staff and Volunteers

The charity can never be self supporting and so the directors recognise and thank all those who contribute to our funding - local government sources, various charitable trusts, donations and parental/staff fund raising. The directors are particularly appreciative of grant assistance from The Baily Thomas Charitable Fund, The Hugh Fraser Foundation, Lloyds TSB Foundation for Scotland, Cash for Kids and The Robertson Trust.

The directors acknowledge Glasgow City Council Social Work Department's provision of free transport facilities for our Holiday Playschemes and also its contribution to the Sunday Club transport costs. Similarly, the directors acknowledge the financial assistance of Glasgow City Council Childcare Partnership via its direct payment of staff training costs.

We thank our supporters, staff and volunteers for their considerable contributions during the year and look forward to their continuing support in the future.

Reserves Policy

The directors' policy is to hold a level of reserves equivalent to approximately six months worth of operating costs. Unrestricted funds were maintained at this level throughout the year.

Statement on Risk

1. Accounting Policies

Accounting Convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective June 2002), the historical cost convention and under the guidelines laid down in the Statement of Recommended Practice - Accounting and Reporting by Charities (2000).

Income

Donations and bank interest are accounted for when received.

Registration fees and grants are accounted for on an accruals basis.

Grants

Revenue grants are recognised in the Income and Expenditure Account so as to match them with the expenditure towards which they are intended to contribute.

Tangible Fixed Assets

Depreciation is provided on assets on a straight-line basis in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life as follows: -

Unrestricted funds comprise grants and other income received for the objects of the charity without further specified purpose and are available as general funds.
