Notes to the Abbreviated Financial Statements for the Year Ended 30 September 2000

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention as modified by the revaluation of certain assets and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective March 2000).

Turnover

Turnover represents net invoiced sales of services, excluding value added tax.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Freehold property - not provided
Leasehold property - not provided
Short Rotation Coppice - not provided
Viewing Platform - 100% on cost

Fixtures and fittings - 25% on reducing balance Computer equipment - 25% on reducing balance

Deferred taxation

Provision is made at current rates for taxation deferred in respect of all material timing differences except to the extent that, in the opinion of the directors, there is reasonable probability that the liability will not arise in the foreseeable future.

Hire purchase and leasing commitments

Rentals paid under operating leases are charged to the profit and loss account as incurred.

Pensions

The company operates a defined contribution pension scheme. Contributions payable for the year are charged in the profit and loss account.

Government grants

Revenue grants are credited to the profit and loss account to offset against matching expenditure. Grants of a capital nature are offset against the capital expenditure to which they relate.

Establishment provision

The establishment provision comprises the estimated costs of setting up the various land management projects undertaken by the company. These costs are charged to the profit and loss account as the sites are acquired.

Non-consolidation

Group accounts are not prepared by virtue of the exemptions conferred by s.248 of the Companies Act 1985. The financial statements present information about the company and not about the group.
