FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2011

The directors, who are also the trustees for the purpose of charity law, present their report and accounts for the year ended 31 March 2011.

The accounts have been prepared in accordance with the accounting policies set out in note 1 to the accounts and comply with the charity's Articles of Association, Memorandum of Association, applicable law and the requirements of the Statement of Recommended Practice, "Accounting and Reporting by Charities" issued in October 2005.

The Aberdeenshire Life Education Centre was approved by the Inland Revenue Charity Division on 12 January 1999. The charitable company is a registered charity (registration number SC 028726).

Structure, governance and management

The charity is a charitable company limited by guarantee. The charitable company's objects are to enable young people to make positive choices about their health and to resist the pressures they may face to experiment with drugs.

None of the directors has any beneficial interest in the company.

Directors of the company are recruited by way of nomination by the existing directors of the company and appointed at the Annual General Meeting. New directors receive informal advice and information from existing directors regarding their duties and objectives of the charity.

Objectives, activities and achievements

The year proved to be another milestone in the evolution of ALEC. Julie Collins completed her training to join Lorraine Morrice and Kim Dodd as a full-time Educator, and Lesley Penny as relief Educator. The third mobile classroom was ordered, delivered and subsequently launched at a successful event in Banchory attended by our Patron, councillors, and other VIPs just after the October 2010 mid-term break.

Thereafter, for the first time, ALEC had 3 Mobile classrooms manned by 3 Educators delivering a quality health education programme to all nursery and primary school children throughout Aberdeenshire. During 2009/10 academic year 104 schools were visited and sessions were delivered to 14,458 pupils. 1,051 parents attended the awareness raising sessions that were offered in every school. With the new mobile classroom in place the statistics for 2010/11 should improve further.

A Transition Assembly Programme to engage parents across Aberdeenshire was piloted and parents were offered "How To Drug Proof Your Kids" courses which will allow young people and their carers to improve communication. To Improve the pupil experience of health and substance misuse education during transition from primary to secondary, a new programme for S1 pupils with a particular emphasis on smoking prevention was supported by the funding supplied by Aberdeenshire Local Tobacco Alliance.

The Educator's enthusiasm and commitment, along with that of Alan Cameron, the tower, has been instrumental in delivering the ALEC programme throughout a year interrupted for long periods due to snow. The support of Aberdeenshire Council, in particular, Quality Improvement Officer, Audrey Hendry, has been much appreciated.

Members of the ALEC committee have met regularly throughout the year and continue to throw their support behind the Charity.

Financial review

The results for the year show a surplus after accounting for the grant received from Aberdeenshire Council. The council continues to meet all running expenditure of the mobiles with effect from August 2004. From this date, however the charity continued to pay for operational expenses that were not paid directly by the council. The operational expenses were reimbursed from Aberdeenshire Council at a later date.

Reserves policy

The company operates two main funds. The unrestricted funds have arisen from past activities and the restricted funds have been received for specific purposes. The directors have examined the requirement for unrestricted funds and consider that there are adequate resources to allow the company to maintain it's operational capacity for the forseeable future, given the circumstances in which it operates.

The company is aiming to build up reserves to meet the refurbishment expenditure of the two existing mobiles which will be required in the next two years.

1 Accounting policies

1.1 Basis of preparation

The accounts have been prepared under the historical cost convention and are in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standards for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008).

The accounts have been prepared in accordance with applicable accounting standards, the Statement of Recommended Practice, "Accounting and Reporting by Charities", issued in March 2005, the Companies Act 2006, the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 and the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006.

The charity has availed itself of s396 of the Companies Act 2006, as permitted in paragraph 4(1) of Schedule 1 of SI 2008 No 409, and adapted the Companies Act formats to reflect the special nature of the charity's activities.

1.2 Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included in full in the Statement of Financial Activities in the year in which the charity is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accruacy.

Donated services are included at the open market value for the service.

1.3 Resources expended

All expenditure is included on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all costs related to that category and includes attributable VAT which cannot be recovered.

1.4 Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less depreciation. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost less estimated residual value of each asset over its expected useful life, as follows:

Plant and machinery

- 10% straight line and 33.33% straight line

1.5 Stock

Stock is valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

1.6 Unrestricted funds

Unrestricted funds are incoming resources generated for the objects of the charity without further specified purposes and are available for general funds.

1.7 Restricted funds

Restricted funds are subject to specific conditions by donors as to how they may be used. The purposes and uses of the restricted funds are set out in the notes to the accounts.
