The accounts have been prepared in accordance with the accounting policies set out in note 1 to the accounts and comply with the charity's Articles of Association, Memorandum of Association, applicable law and the requirements of the Statement of Recommended Practice, "Accounting and Reporting by Charities" issued in 2005.

The Aberdeenshire Life Education Centre was approved by the Inland Revenue Charity Division on 12 January 1999. The charitable company is a registered charity (registration number SC 028726).

Structure, governance and management

The charity is a charitable company limited by guarantee.

None of the directors has any beneficial interest in the company.

Directors of the company are recruited by way of nomination by the existing directors of the company and appointed at the Annual General Meeting. New directors receive informal advice and information from existing directors regarding their duties and the objectives of the charity.

Objectives and activities

The charitable company's objects are to enable young people to make positive choices about their health and to resist the pressures they may face to experiment with drugs.

After a busy couple of years developing new programmes and fundraising for a new Mobile Classroom, the past year has largely been used to consolidate what we have achieved and concentrate on the delivery of programmes. However, in response to demand from schools, the Committee, along with Aberdeenshire Council, has supported the development of a new internet safety programme, "bCyberwise", and associated resources by Coram Life Education. Our educators have been involved in piloting the programme locally.

In the course of the 2014/15 season, visits were made to 87 nurseries, 151 primary schools, 17 academies and 4 special needs schools. Sessions were delivered to 22,857 primary and nursery pupils, 5,081 secondary pupils and 256 special needs pupils. Parent sessions were offered at all primary schools and 1,279 parents attended.

The Educators' commitment has again been instrumental in delivering the ALEC programmes throughout the year. The continued support of Aberdeenshire Council is appreciated.

The committee met on five occasions throughout the year. The committee are also represented at regular Steering Group meetings with the Council. The Chairman is an elected Trustee of our parent body, Coram Life Education, representing "Celtic" region.

Achievements and performance

Financial review

The results for the year show a deficit of £2,077 (2014: surplus of £38,109). During the year to 31 March 2014 the charity received donations of £45,000 which were used to fund the purchase of a new mobile classroom, no such donations were received in the current year. The council continues to meet all running expenditure of the mobiles with effect from August 2004. From this date, however the charity continued to pay for operational expenses that were not paid directly by the council.

Reserves policy

The company operates two main funds. The unrestricted funds have arisen from past activities and the restricted funds have been received for specific purposes. The directors have examined the requirement for unrestricted funds and consider that adequate resources to cover 6 months expenditure is enough to allow the company to maintain it's operational capacity for the foreseeable future, given the circumstances in which it operates.

The company is aiming to build up reserves to provide for the ongoing maintenance and eventual replacement of the mobile classrooms.

1 Accounting policies

1.1 Basis of preparation

The accounts have been prepared under the historic cost convention and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008).

The accounts have been prepared in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice, "Accounting and Reporting by Charities", issued in March 2005 the Companies Act 2006, the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 and the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 (as amended).

The charity has availed itself of s396 of the Companies Act 2006, as permitted in paragraph 4(1) of Schedule 1 of SI 2008 No 409, and adapted the Companies Act formats to reflect the special nature of the charity's activities.

1.2 Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included in full in the Statement of Financial Activities in the year in which the charity is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accruacy.

Donated services are included at the open market value for the service.

1.3 Resources expended

All expenditure is included on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all costs related to that category and includes attributable VAT which cannot be recovered.

1.4 Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less depreciation. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost less estimated residual value of each asset over its expected useful life, as follows:

Plant and machinery

- 10% straight line and 33.33% straight line

1.5 Stock

Stock is valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

1.6 Unrestricted funds

Unrestricted funds are incoming resources generated for the objects of the charity without further specified purposes and are available for general funds.

1.7 Restricted funds

Restricted funds are subject to specific conditions by donors as to how they may be used. The purposes and uses of the restricted funds are set out in the notes to the accounts.
