Directors' Report

The Directors present their report and audited financial statements for the year to 30 April 2010.

REVIEW OF THE BUSINESS AND RESULTS

The Company had no turnover during the year. The Company previously acted as general partner of Aberforth Limited Partnership IA, which was constituted under the Limited Partnerships Act 1907. Aberforth Limited Partnership IA was dissolved on 5 March 2007.

The losses for the period amounted to £288.01 (2009 – losses of £167.50) and this amount has been transferred from the Profit and Loss Account reserve. No final dividend will be declared in respect of the year to 30 April 2010.
