Directors' report for the year ended 31 August 2008

The directors present their report and the audited financial statements for the year ended 31 August 2008.

Results, principal activities and review of business

The company's principal activity was that of an investment company.

The loss for the year attributable to shareholders and reported in the financial statements is £13,000 (2007: £17,000).

On 17 April 2008 the company was acquired by UPP Group Limited for a consideration of £1.

Dividend

The directors are unable to propose the payment of a dividend (2007: £Nil).

At 31 August 2008, none of the directors had any beneficial interest in the shares of the company or in any of the group companies.

Creditor payment terms

When entering into commitments for the purchase of services and goods the company gives due consideration to quality, price and the terms of payment. Suppliers are made aware of these terms. The company abides by these terms where it is satisfied that suppliers have provided the services or goods in accordance with such agreed terms and conditions. In the event of disputes, every effort is made to resolve these quickly.

Notes to the financial statements for the year ended 31 August 2008

1. Principal accounting policies

(a) Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with applicable accounting standards and the Companies Act 1985. The accounting policies remain unchanged from the previous year.

(b) Going concern

The company's immediate parent undertaking, UPP Group Limited has agreed to:

- (i) waive its entitlement to receive any sums outstanding from the company until such time as all other existing and future liabilities have been settled; and
- (ii) write off any sums outstanding from the company, to the extent that the company does not have sufficient funds in the future to settle them.

Accordingly the directors consider that the company is able to meet its liabilities as they fall due and hence that it is appropriate to prepare the accounts on a going concern basis.

(c) Basis of consolidation

The financial statements contain information about UPP (Miller Street A) Limited as an individual company and do not contain consolidated financial information as the parent of a group. The company is exempt under Section 228 of the Companies Act 1985 from the requirements to prepare consolidated financial statements as it and its subsidiary undertakings are included by full consolidation in the consolidated financial statements of its ultimate parent, UPP Group Holdings Limited, a company registered in England and Wales.

(d) Cash flow statement

The company has taken advantage of the exemption available under FRS 1 (revised) and has not prepared a cash flow statement by virtue of being a wholly owned subsidiary.

(e) Taxation

(i) Current tax

The charge for current taxation for the year is based on the result for the year, adjusted for disallowable items.

(ii) Deferred tax

Full provision has been made for deferred taxation in respect of timing differences that have originated, but not reversed at the balance sheet date where an event has occurred that results in an obligation to pay more or less tax in the future by the balance sheet date except that:

 Provision is made for gains on disposal of assets that have been rolled over into replacement assets only to the extent that, at the balance sheet date, there is a binding agreement to dispose of the assets concerned.

(ii) Deferred tax (continued)

- Provision is not made for the remittance of a subsidiary, associate or joint venture's earnings that would cause tax to be payable where no commitment has been made to the remittance of the earnings.
- Deferred tax assets are recognised to the extent that it is more likely than not that there will be suitable taxable profits from which the future reversal of the underlying timing differences can be deducted.

Deferred tax is measured on a non-discounted basis at the tax rates that are expected to apply in the years in which the timing differences reverse, based on the tax rates enacted at the balance sheet date. Group relief is only accounted for to the extent that a formal policy is in place at the year/period end. Where no formal policy is in place, current and deferred tax are measured before benefits which may arise from a formal group relief policy.

(f) Related party transactions

The company is a wholly owned subsidiary undertaking of UPP Group Holdings Limited and as such the company has taken advantage of the terms of FRS 8 not to disclose related party transactions after 17 April 2008 which are eliminated on consolidation.

2. Turnover

Turnover, excluding VAT, represented rental income earned for the year up to the sale of the freehold properties on 31 October 2005.

3. Directors' remuneration

The directors received £Nil (2007: £Nil) in respect of services performed in connection with the management of the affairs of this company.

4. Audit fees

The audit fees payable to the company's auditors for the audit of the company's annual accounts for the year ended 31 August 2008 were £4,000 (2007: £4,000). The fees payable to the company's auditors for the provision of tax services were £1,000 (2007: £1,000)

13. Parent undertaking and controlling party

The company's immediate parent undertaking is UPP Group Limited which is a wholly owned subsidiary of UPP Group Holdings Limited.

UPP Group Holdings Limited is owned by Alma Mater Fund LP (acting through its general partner Barclays Alma Mater General Partner Limited), Barclays European Infrastructure Fund LP (acting through its general partner Barclays European Infrastructure Fund II LP (acting through its general partner Barclays European Infrastructure II Limited). Alma Mater Fund LP and Barclays Alma Mater General Partner Limited are collectively known as 'Alma Mater'.

It is the directors' opinion that, as at 31 August 2008 and 31 August 2007, Alma Mater is the ultimate controlling party.

The smallest and largest group of which the company is a member and for which group accounts are prepared is UPP Group Holdings Limited. Copies of the accounts can be obtained from Companies House, Cardiff CF4 3UZ, once they have been filed.
