NOTES TO THE ABBREVIATED ACCOUNTS

YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2009

1. Accounting policies

Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with applicable accounting standards.

Going concern

During the year the company made a loss of £36,129 (2008: profit of £412,628) and at the balance sheet date, it had net liabilities of £132,162 (2008: £96,033).

The financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis which assumes that the company will continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future.

The company meets its day to day working capital requirements through support from it's directors and the company's bankers. The bank loan facility is in place until 31 March 2010 and the directors believe that the facility will continue to be extended on substantially similar terms if required. In addition, the directors have committed to provide sufficient funding to satisfy the company's obligations and liabilities by providing whatever support is required for at least one year from the date of signing the financial statements.

On the basis of the above, the directors consider it appropriate to prepare the financial statements on a going concern basis.

If the company was unable to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future, adjustments would have to be made to amend the balance sheet values of assets to their recoverable amounts, to provide for further liabilities that might arise and to reclassify fixed assets and long term assets and liabilities as current assets and liabilities.

Cash flow statement

The directors have taken advantage of the exemption in Financial Reporting Standard No 1 (Revised 1996) from including a cash flow statement in the financial statements on the grounds that the company is small.

Turnover

The turnover shown in the profit and loss account represents amounts invoiced during the previous year for the sale of property, exclusive of Value Added Tax.

Stocks and work in progress

Stocks, which comprises land and property, are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

1. Accounting policies (continued)

Deferred taxation

Deferred tax is recognised in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed at the balance sheet date, where transactions or events that result in an obligation to pay more or a right to pay less tax in the future have occurred by the balance sheet date with certain limited exceptions.

A deferred tax asset is regarded as recoverable and therefore recognised only when, on the basis of all available evidence, it can be regarded as more likely than not that there will be suitable taxable profits from which the future reversal of the underlying timing difference can be deducted.

Deferred tax is calculated on an undiscounted basis at the tax rates that are expected to apply in the periods in which the timing differences are expected to reverse, based on tax rates and laws enacted or substantively enacted at the balance sheet date.

Financial instruments

Financial instruments are classified and accounted for, according to the substance of the contractual arrangement, as either financial assets, financial liabilities or equity instruments. An equity instrument is any contract that evidences a residual interest in the assets of the company after deducting all of its liabilities.

2. Secured creditors

Included within creditors falling due within one year is a bank loan of £523,000 (2008: £502,309) and a bank overdraft of £179 (2008: £nìl) which is secured by a first ranking standard security over the company's property, a first ranking bond and floating charge over the whole assets of the company and an interest shortfall guarantee from the directors. The bank loan incurs interest at 2% over LIBOR and is repayable on 31 March 2010.
