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REPORT OF THE DIRECTORS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31st MARCH 2008

The trustees, who are also directors of the charity for the purposes of the Companies Act, present their annual report and financial statements for the year ended 31st March 2008. The directors have adopted the provisions of the Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP) "Accounting and Reporting by Charities" issued in October 2000 in preparing their annual report and financial statements of the charity.

Objects of the charity, principal activities and organisation of our work

The charity is constituted as a company limited by guarantee, and is, therefore, governed by a memorandum and articles of association

The charity's object and its principal activity continues to be that of the provision of assistance to the disabled to find suitable housing in Fife

The charity is organised so that the directors meet regularly to manage its affairs

Development, activities and achievements during the period

The directors consider that the development of the charity has been satisfactory

The charity would not be able to function without continued voluntary input from the directors and other workers

Transactions and financial position

The statement of financial activities shows net expenditure of £7,957 for the year, and reserves of £25,818, in total, as at the year end

This level of reserves is required to meet future operating commitments

Directors and Trustees

All directors of the company are also trustees of the charity, there are no other trustees. One director retired and two directors were appointed at the AGM. The board has the power to appoint additional directors as it considers fit to do so

Risk Management

The directors actively review the major risks which the charity faces on a regular basis and believe that maintaining reserves at current levels, combined with regular reviews of controls over key financial systems, will provide sufficient resources in the event of adverse conditions. The directors have also examined other operational and business risks faced by the charity and confirm that they have established systems to mitigate the significant risks.

Directors' responsibilities in relation to the financial statements

The directors are required by company law to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the financial activities of the charity and of its financial position at the end of that year. State whether the policies adopted are in accordance with the Companies Act 1985 and with applicable accounting standards and statements of recommended practice, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements,
