Notes to the Abbreviated Accounts for the Year Ended 31 December 2009

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

Goina Concern

The company made a net profit for the year of £125,658 and has net current liabilities of £1,245,232 at the year end. The ability of the company to meet its liabilities as they fall due is dependent on the continued provision of borrowing facilities from the company's bankers and the support of the director/shareholder who has made a loan to the company and has granted a personal guarantee to the bank. He will not seek repayment of his loan to the company to the detriment of other creditors. He will continue to provide financial support to allow the company to meet its liabilities as they fall due. However, there remains material uncertainty over whether the company can continue as a going concern.

Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention as modified by the revaluation of certain assets and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008).

Turnove

Turnover represents rents receivable, excluding value added tax.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Plant and machinery

- 20% on cost

Deferred tax

Deferred tax is recognised in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed at the balance sheet date.

Investment Properties

Investment properties are shown at their open market value. The surplus or deficit arising from the revaluation is transferred to the investment revaluation reserve unless a deficit, or its reversal, on an individual property is expected to be permanent, in which case it is recognised in the profit and loss account for the year.

This is in accordance with the FRSSE, which, unlike the Companies Act 2006, does not require depreciation of investment properties. Investment properties are held for their investment potential and their current value is of prime importance. This departure from the provisions of the Companies Act is required in order to give a true and fair view.
