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Report of the Trustees for the Year Ended 31 March 2017

The trustees who are also directors of the charity for the purposes of the Companies Act 2006, present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 March 2017. The financial statements comply with the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005, the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 (as amended), the Companies Act 2006, the Memorandum and Articles of Association, and Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard 102.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and aims

The Trust is led and managed by members of the community. As a community organisation the Trust manages community facilities and develops activities and initiatives within the hub, innerzone, hubSports and the Connie in line with the community need and demand. In addition, to the community facilities within the Easterhouse area of Glasgow, Connect also operates a furniture reuse and recycling operation called ReConnect Glasgow.

The Trust's remit is much wider than just a facility operator and providing access to a range of training, employment, health and other education services and community support.

The Trust is a creative and inspirational organisation that has a vision for community-run and controlled services through the empowerment of local people. The Trust provides a holistic service that doesn't cater for just one section of the community but caters for the diverse range of ages and needs within a community as a whole. Providing a mix of support, social, environmental and education activities that creates a supportive and progressive community and environ.

STRATEGIC REPORT

Achievement and performance

Charitable activities

Over the past year, Connect has continued to develop the services that are offered in line with community need and demand with some excellent community successes but recognises that this year has been a financially difficult year.

Some of the achievements/highlights this year have included:

- The launch of a dedicated Futures Development Programme: focused on the support provided to over 40 volunteers within Connect services and the help needed for progression on to further opportunities and employment.
- The peoples Gateway Project (employment and training support service): 701 people have been supported through Welfare Reform, with many avoiding sanctions by learning the skills needed for jobsearch and accessing training. The PG project has also supported many with debt problems and financial issues.
- Youth Services within Innerzone, the Connie youth clubs have helped 295 young people through the drop-in youth clubs and dedicated educational workshops over the year. Supporting young people to gain qualifications and deal with any issues or barriers that they may be facing. In addition, a new sports and fitness programme was introduced that has increased the physical activity of 186 young people.
- Wellhouse allotments continues to work with people with additional needs and also supported young people with education and adults in physical activity. The allotments has developed the services provided including animal welfare, education on biodiversity and recycling with the community as a whole embracing and supporting the ventures.
- ReConnect Glasgow (future reuse and recycling): operations have supported 15 trainees and volunteers and over 200 families with access to furniture and affordable household items. New partnerships with housing associations across the East End of Glasgow and ensuring that support is provided to the most vulnerable clients and that our charitable aims and objectives are met by not only the supply of furniture but through education and links to support services and personal progression.

In relation to the performance of operations Connect has been successfully helping and supporting local people to make changes in their own lives and the community as a whole however, the Board of Connect recognises that this year has been a financially difficult one and to ensure sustainability a number of actions have had to be initiated to mitigate financial risk. Over the coming months Connect is carrying out a review of all services and activities in relation to financial risk and plans put in place to ensure that any issues are addressed but also so that our continued impact and support to the community continues.

STRATEGIC REPORT

Financial review

Financial review

The Group had net outgoing resources of £81,608 (2016: net outgoing resources of £8,748) for the year and has accumulated funds of £620,759 (2016: £702,367) at the balance sheet date. The Charity had net outgoing resources of £76,796 (2016: net outgoing resources of £6,768) for the year and has accumulated funds of £631,155 (2016: £707,951) at the balance sheet date.

Reserves policy

It is the policy of the charity to maintain unrestricted funds at a level to provide sufficient funds to cover 3 months management and administration costs.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document

The charity is incorporated as a company limited by guarantee without a share capital and is recognised as a Scottish charity. The company was established under a Memorandum of Association which established the objects and powers of the charitable company and is governed under its Articles of Association. Under those Articles, the board of directors are elected by the company in general meeting, and directors shall retire by rotation.

Appointment of Trustees

Trustees are appointed at the discretion of the board.

Group Structure

Connect Community Trust Limited has a wholly owned subsidiary, Connect-In Enterprises Limited. The activities of this company are consolidated with those of Connect Community Trust Limited.

Related parties

Some of the Trustees of Connect Community Trust are Committee Members of Provanhall Housing Association. Details of transactions between the Trust and this Housing Association is included within Note 18.

Some of the Trustees of Connect Community Trust are Directors of Connect-In Enterprises Ltd a wholly owned subsidiary of Connect Community Trust. Details of transactions between the Trust and Connect-In Enterprises Ltd are also included within Note 18.

Risk management

The trustees have assessed the risks to which the charity is exposed, in particular those related to the operations and finances of the charity and are satisfied that procedures are in place to mitigate these risks.

Report of the Independent Auditors to the Trustees and Members of Connect Community Trust Limited

We have audited the financial statements of Connect Community Trust Limited for the year ended 31 March 2017 on pages six to nineteen. The financial reporting framework that has been applied in their preparation is applicable law and United Kingdom Accounting Standards (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice), including Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland'.

This report is made solely to the charitable company's members, as a body, in accordance with Chapter 3 of Part 16 of the Companies Act 2006, and to the charitable company's trustees, as a body, in accordance with Section 44(1)(c) of the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 and regulation 10 of the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006. Our audit work has been undertaken so that we might state to the charitable company's members and trustees those matters we are required to state to them in an auditors' report and for no other purpose. To the fullest extent permitted by law, we do not accept or assume responsibility to anyone other than the charitable company and the charitable company's members and trustees as a body, for our audit work, for this report, or for the opinions we have formed.

Respective responsibilities of trustees and auditors

As explained more fully in the Statement of Trustees Responsibilities set out on page three, the trustees (who are also the directors of the charitable company for the purposes of company law) are responsible for the preparation of the financial statements and for being satisfied that they give a true and fair view.

We have been appointed as auditors under Section 44(1)(c) of the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 and under the Companies Act 2006 and report in accordance with regulations made under those Acts.

Our responsibility is to audit and express an opinion on the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and International Standards on Auditing (UK and Ireland). Those standards require us to comply with the Auditing Practices Board's Ethical Standards for Auditors.

Scope of the audit of the financial statements

An audit involves obtaining evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements sufficient to give reasonable assurance that the financial statements are free from material misstatement, whether caused by fraud or error. This includes an assessment of: whether the accounting policies are appropriate to the charitable company's circumstances and have been consistently applied and adequately disclosed; the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by the trustees; and the overall presentation of the financial statements. In addition, we read all the financial and non-financial information in the Report of the Trustees to identify material inconsistencies with the audited financial statements and to identify any information that is apparently materially incorrect based on, or materially inconsistent with, the knowledge acquired by us in the course of performing the audit. If we become aware of any apparent material misstatements or inconsistencies we consider the implications for our report.

Basis for the qualified opinion on the financial statements

The financial statements have been prepared on the assumption that Connect Community Trust Limited will continue as a going concern. However, Connect Community Trust Limited has incurred a deficit of £76,796 in the year. The operation of Connect Community Trust Limited is dependent on it receiving continued financial assistance from external sources. Like many social enterprises in Scotland, Connect Community Trust Limited's ability to quantify and confirm the level of future public sector income (derived from grants and service contracts) is limited at present.

These conditions raise doubt as to the ability to continue as a going concern. We have been unable to obtain sufficient evidence to support the opinion of the trustees with respect to going concern.

The financial statements do not contain any adjustment relating to recoverability and classification of any asset carrying amounts or amounts and classification of liabilities that might result should Connect Community Trust Limited be unable to continue as a going concern.

Opinion on other matter prescribed by the Companies Act 2006

In our opinion the information given in the Report of the Trustees for the financial year for which the financial statements are prepared is consistent with the financial statements.

Notes to the Consolidated Financial Statements for the Year Ended 31 March 2017

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charitable company, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention with the exception of investments which are included at market value.

Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Allocation and apportionment of costs

Support costs have been allocated between governance costs and other support costs. Governance costs will include costs related to statutory audit and other direct costs related to public accountability.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Long leasehold - over the lease term
Plant and machinery - 25% on cost
Motor vehicles - 25% on cost
Computer equipment - 33% on cost

It is the policy of the charity to capitalise items of expenditure over £1,500.

Stocks

Funds expended in bringing certain donated goods to a saleable condition are recognised as a cost of stock on the Balance Sheet until sold.

Taxation

The Charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

Activity based reporting

The Trustees are of the opinion that the charity's activities are interlinked and there is no merit in providing further analysis within the notes to the accounts.

Donated goods

The nature of the donated goods are predominantly high volume and low value items and on that basis these donated goods are not recognised on receipt, rather the value to the charity of the donated goods for resale is recognised as income when sold. Funds expended in bringing certain donated goods to a saleable condition are recognised as a cost of stock on the Balance Sheet until sold. On sale of the donated goods the value of the related stock cost is charged against the related income under the heading 'other trading activities'.
