The trustees, who are also the directors of the charity for the purposes of the Companies Act, submit their annual report and the unaudited financial statements for year ended 30 June 2012.

GOVERNING DOCUMENTS

Out of the Box is a charitable company limited by guarantee. It was incorporated on 21 June 2004 and commenced activities on 1 July 2004. The company is governed by its Memorandum and Articles of Association. In the event of the company being wound up, members are required to contribute an amount not exceeding £1.

RECRUITMENT AND APPOINTMENT OF THE MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE

Out of the Box is run by a Management Committee which comprises eight directors, together with other experienced advisers. The members of the Committee are in regular touch in order to decide management issues. The Management Committee is appointed under the Memorandum and Articles of Association. Members are appointed to serve for one year, after which they must be re-appointed. The directors are made fully aware of their responsibilities as trustees of the charity.

RISK MANAGEMENT

The Management Committee regularly reviews the financial and non-financial risks that the charity could face, and action has been taken to mitigate these risks, including a regular reviews of insurance and health and safety procedures.

OUR AIMS AND CHARITABLE OBJECTIVES

The principal aim of the charity is:-

To promote the advancement of the Christian Faith and to worship God, in Scotland and elsewhere, by any means whatsoever, including the preaching and proclamation of the Christian Gospel and, through puppetry, and the teaching of Christian doctrine and principles.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

There was a deficit for the year of £4,552 This, when deducted from the funds brought forward of £16,071 gives rise to a total of unrestricted funds carried forward of £11,519. The directors are able to confirm, therefore, that sufficient funds are available in order to meet the immediate needs of the charity, but care must be taken to ensure that sufficient funds are raised to finance future activities.

REVIEW OF THE YEAR AND ACHIEVEMENTS

The charity employs a full-time Children's Worker, Chris Watt and a part-time Associate Children's Worker, Carol Hutchison.

Chris and Carol work with schools and churches across the North of Scotland. They have worked with a large number of schools leading assemblies, RME classes and performing puppet musicals.

Out of the Box worked closely with a number of churches, helping them lead Holiday Clubs for the children of their local community, and also providing Children's work and puppet training. Outreach event and other puppet shows were performed throughout the year for churches or church groups around the Highlands.

In December 2011, OOTB hosted a Christmas Market which was attended by well over 200 hundred people. The event helped promote local Christian business's and also the work of Out of the Box.

Also in December 2011, Out of the Box performed their Puppet Christmas Musical in 16 schools across the North of Scotland. This was well received by the schools.

The Directors are extremely grateful for the support of a growing number of individuals and churches for their financial support for the charity.

FUTURE PLANS

The Management Committee hopes that the charity will continue to develop its work with schools and churches in the Highlands of Scotland.

 for its beneficiaries. It includes both costs that can be allocated directly to such activities and those costs of an
 indirect nature necessary to support them.
- Governance costs include those costs associated with meeting the constitutional and statutory requirements
 of the charity and include professional fees and costs linked to the strategic management of the charity.
