The trustees, who are also the directors of the charity for the purposes of the Companies Act, submit their annual report and the unaudited financial statements for year ended 30 June 2009.

GOVERNING DOCUMENTS

Out of the Box is a charitable company limited by guarantee. It was incorporated on 21 June 2004 and commenced activities on 1 July 2004. The company is governed by its Memorandum and Articles of Association. In the event of the company being wound up, members are required to contribute an amount not exceeding £1.

RECRUITMENT AND APPOINTMENT OF THE MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE

Out of the Box is run by a Management Committee which comprises three directors, together with other experienced advisers. The members of the Committee are in regular touch in order to decide management issues. The Management Committee is appointed under the Memorandum and Articles of Association. Members are appointed to serve for one year, after which they must be re-appointed. The directors are made fully aware of their responsibilities as trustees of the charity.

RISK MANAGEMENT

The Management Committee regularly reviews the financial and non-financial risks that the charity could face, and action has been taken to mitigate these risks

OUR AIMS AND CHARITABLE OBJECTIVES

The principal aim of the charity is:-

To promote the advancement of the Christian Faith and to worship God in Scotland and elsewhere by any means whatsoever, including the preaching and proclamation of the Christian Gospel and, through puppetry, the teaching of Christian doctrine and principles.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

There was a surplus for the year of £755 This when added to the funds brought forward of £335, gives rise to a total of funds carried forward of £1,090 The directors are very grateful for all the support given to the charity during the year, both financially and in other ways. The directors are able to confirm, therefore, that sufficient funds are available in order to meet the immediate needs of the charity, but care must be taken to ensure that sufficient funds are raised to finance future activities.

The Trustees received no remuneration during the year. Andrew Wilson received £275 towards out of pocket expenses (see note 5 to the accounts).

REVIEW OF THE YEAR AND ACHIEVEMENTS

The charity has continued its involvement with a creative praise and worship event for children in Inverness, called 'Jump' - which was held on a quarterly basis. Puppet shows were performed throughout the year -mainly for churches or church groups in the Highlands. One highlight, however, was the performance of three 30 minute puppet shows at the Royal Highland Show, Edinburgh (on the Church of Scotland stand).

FUTURE PLANS

The Charity hopes to continue to provide individual children's puppet shows for churches and church groups, either as invitation - only events, or for public performances. The Management Committee hopes that the charity will become more involved in workshops and performances in schools in the Highlands of Scotland, together with other regular church programmes.

a) Basis of accounting

- Voluntary income is received by way of donations & gifts and is included in full in the Statement of Financial Activities when receivable.
- Investment income is included when receivable.

d) Resources expended

Expenditure is recognized on an accruals basis as a liability is incurred.

- Charitable expenditure comprises those costs incurred by the charity in the delivery of its activities and services
 for its beneficiaries. It includes both costs that can be allocated directly to such activities and those costs of an
 indirect nature necessary to support them.
- Governance costs include those costs associated with meeting the constitutional and statutory requirements
 of the charity and include professional fees and costs linked to the strategic management of the charity.
