# **GOVERNING DOCUMENTS**

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Out of the Box is a charitable company limited by guarantee. It was incorporated on 21 June 2004 and commenced activities on 1 July 2004. The company is governed by its Memorandum and Articles of Association. In the event of the company being wound up, members are required to contribute an amount not exceeding £1.

# RECRUITMENT AND APPOINTMENT OF THE MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE

Out of the Box is run by a Management Committee which comprises six directors, together with other experienced advisers. The members of the Committee are in regular touch in order to decide management issues. The Management Committee is appointed under the Memorandum and Articles of Association. Members are appointed to serve for one year, after which they must be re-appointed. The directors are made fully aware of their responsibilities as trustees of the charity.

# **OUR AIMS AND CHARITABLE OBJECTIVES**

The principal aim of the charity is:-

To promote the advancement of the Christian Faith and to worship God, in Scotland and elsewhere, by any means whatsoever, including the preaching and proclamation of the Christian Gospel and, through puppetry, the teaching of Christian doctrine and principles.

#### FINANCIAL REVIEW

There was a surplus for the year of £12,448. This, when added to the funds brought forward of £1,090, gives rise to a total of unrestricted funds carried forward of £13,538. The directors are very grateful for all the support given to the charity during the year, both financially and in other ways. The directors are able to confirm, therefore, that sufficient funds are available in order to meet the immediate needs of the charity, but care must be taken to ensure that sufficient funds are raised to finance future activities.

#### REVIEW OF THE YEAR AND ACHIEVEMENTS

The charity has employed a full-time Children's Worker, Chris Watt. Chris works with schools and churches across the North of Scotland. Chris has visited over 20 different schools working with various groups of children in a workshop setting, exploring a particular theme. Workshops include the use of a variety of creative arts including puppetry, song and drama. The aim of these workshops is the involvement of the children in a whole school Religious Observance Assembly.

Chris has also worked closely with a number of churches, helping them lead Holiday Clubs for the children of their local community and also providing Children's work training. Puppet shows were also performed throughout the year for churches or church groups around the Highlands.

The Directors are extremely grateful for the support of a number of individuals, The Souter Foundation and the Parish Development Fund for their financial support of the charity.

## **FUTURE PLANS**

The Charity hopes to continue to support its full-time Children's Worker, Chris Watt. The Management Committee hopes that the charity will continue to develop its work with schools and churches in the Highlands of Scotland.

#### 1 ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### a) Basis of accounting

The Financial Statements are prepared under the historical cost convention. They comply with relevant legislation and with the Statement of Recommended Practice: Accounting and Reporting by Charities issued in March 2005.

#### b) Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds are available for use at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the general objectives of the charity.

#### c) Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included in the statement of financial activities when the charity is entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy. The following specific policies are applied to particular categories of income:-

- Voluntary income is received by way of donations & gifts and is included in full in the Statement of Financial Activities when receivable.
- Investment income is included when receivable.

#### d) Resources expended

Expenditure is recognized on an accruals basis as a liability is incurred.

- Charitable expenditure comprises those costs incurred by the charity in the delivery of its activities and services for its beneficiaries. It includes both costs that can be allocated directly to such activities and those costs of an indirect nature necessary to support them.
- Governance costs include those costs associated with meeting the constitutional and statutory requirements
  of the charity and include professional fees and costs linked to the strategic management of the charity.
