Report of the Directors for the year ended 30 June 2014

The Directors are pleased to present their report together with the financial statements of the company for the year ended 30 June 2014.

Status of Charity and Governing Document

Out of the Box (Scotland) Limited is a company limited by guarantee (Number SC269608) and is a registered Scottish charity (Number SC035701), governed by its Memorandum and Articles of Association.

In the event of the charity being wound up, each company member undertakes to contribute to the assets of the company such amounts as may be required, not exceeding £1.

Aims and Charitable objectives

The principal aim of the charity is:

To promote the advancement of the Christian Faith and to worship God, in Scotland and elsewhere, by any means whatsoever, including the preaching and proclamation of the Christian Gospel and, through puppetry, and the teaching of Christian doctrine and principles.

Appointment of Trustees

Out of the Box is run by The Board which comprises nine directors. The directors are in regular touch in order to decide management issues. Directors are appointed under the Memorandum and Articles of Association. One third of the directors retire each year, by length of current appointment, and are eligible for re- election.

Achievements and Performance

The charity employs a full-time Children's Worker, Chris Watt and a part-time Associate Children's Worker, Carol Hutchison.

Chris and Carol work with schools and churches across the North of Scotland. They have worked with a large number of schools leading assemblies, RME classes and performing puppet musicals.

Report of the Directors for the year ended 30 June 2014 (Cont'd)

Out of the Box worked closely with seven individual churches, helping them lead a week long Holiday Club for the children of their local community over the summer months. We also provided children's work training for all the volunteers.

In March 2014 Out of the Box hosted their second Puppet Training Day with around 30 people attending. This comprised a full day of training on basic and advanced puppetry skills.

Outreach events and other puppet shows were performed throughout the year for churches or church groups around the Highlands, including our Puppet Christmas Musical during December 2013.

The Directors are extremely grateful to a growing number of individuals and churches for their financial support.

Financial review

There was a surplus for the year of £15,217 (2013: £2,795). This, when added to the funds brought forward of £14,314 (2013: £11,519) gives rise to a total of funds carried forward of £29,531 (2013: £14,314). The amounts held in each fund are shown in note 15 of the accounts. The directors consider that sufficient funds are available in order to meet the immediate needs of the charity.

Reserves

It is the policy of the company to maintain unrestricted funds, i.e. funds not committed or invested in fixed assets, at a level which equates to approximately three months unrestricted expenditure. This allows sufficient funds to enable the ongoing work of the company to be maintained. The general fund held at 30 June 2014 was £24,814 (2013: £2,964) and is more than the target level. Total reserves amounted to £29,531 (2013: £14,314).

Statement on risk

The Board regularly reviews the financial and non-financial risks that the charity could face, and action has been taken to mitigate these risks, including regular reviews of insurance and health and safety procedures.

Future plans

The Management Committee hopes that the charity will continue to develop its work with schools and churches in the North of Scotland.

Report of the Directors for the year ended 30 June 2014 (Cont'd)

Statement of Directors' Responsibilities

Charity law requires the Directors to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of the charity's affairs and of its incoming resources and application of resources, including its surplus or deficit for that year, and which have been properly prepared from and are in agreement with the accounting records of the charity and comply with relevant disclosure requirements.

In preparing those financial statements, the Directors are required to:

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- state whether applicable accounting standards and statements of recommended practice have been followed subject to any departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements; and
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charity will continue in business.

The Directors are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the charity's financial position and enable the Directors to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 2006. The Directors are also responsible for taking such steps as are reasonably open to them to safeguard the charity's assets and to prevent and detect fraud and other irregularities.

Accounting Convention

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 (as amended) and under the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008), the historical cost convention and under the guidelines laid down in the Statement of Recommended Practice - Accounting and Reporting by Charities (2005).

Basis of financial statements
