### Report of the trustees (incorporating the directors' report) for the year ended 31 March 2014

The trustees present their report and the financial statements for the year ended 31 March 2014. The trustees, who are also directors of Angus Womens Aid Ltd for the purposes of company law and who served during the year and up to the date of this report are set out on page 1.

#### Structure, governance and management

Angus Women's Aid is a company limited by guarantee having no share capital and is governed by a Memorandum and Articles of Association. The company is registered as a charity in Scotland, charity number SC 013604.

The Trustees, who meet every month, administer the group. A manager is appointed by the Trustees to manage the day to day operations of the company. The Trustees are elected at the annual general meeting, 1/3 of Trustees are required to retire by rotation at the AGM but are eligible for re-election.

#### Objectives and activities

The principal activities of the charity in the period under review are:

To provide temporary refuge for women and children where the women have suffered abuse (mental, physical or sexual) in their home within a relationship with a man.

To offer support, information and help to any women and accompanying children who ask for help, whether or not they are refuge residents. Also to offer support and aftercare to any women and children who have left temporary refuge accommodation.

To promote equal opportunities for, and participation of, women in society to enable them to determine their future.

To provide opportunities for the educational and emotional needs of the children to be met, particularly those resident in refuge.

To encourage statutory authorities and other agencies to recognise their obligations, legal and otherwise, towards abused women and any accompanying children with respect to the abuse of women and its prevention.

To encourage research into the causes, the prevention and relief of such suffering and abuse of women.

Significant activities for achieving objectives

The charity continued to provide refuge and support to women and children suffering from abuse during the year.

### Report of the trustees (incorporating the directors' report) for the year ended 31 March 2014

#### Achievements and performance

This has been a year of consolidation following the major changes implemented in the previous year. We have continued to build good working relationships to enable better partnership working with other agencies, both statutory and voluntary. However, we see the next few years again bringing changes to Angus Women's Aid as we continue to grow and develop, directed by the changing needs of women, children and young people.

One of our key priorities for the coming year will be to strengthen our Board by recruiting additional members whose expertise is in the wider field of violence against women and gender based violence.

Throughout this year we have strived to make the most effective and efficient use of resources to provide a comprehensive and person-centred service for women and children who are experiencing, or have experienced, domestic abuse.

We have faced new challenges with the increase of women and children coming into Angus from Eastern Europe. Translation costs have therefore become a significant issue. This is further compounded when women are deemed to have no recourse to public funds thereby denying them access to many services.

The welfare reform changes have required staff members to undertake a considerable amount of training but have also resulted in a closer and better working relationship with welfare rights workers.

We are also encountering the wider implications of violence against women including honour based violence and in this year members of our staff have been heavily involved in a multi-agency team to write protocols for Angus on Honour-Based Violence, FGM and Forced Marriage. These protocols will be signed off and available in the next financial year.

The Children's Service has been much in demand this year and we are now inundated with requests from schools and community groups to deliver workshops and sessions on subjects such as relationships, dating abuse and internet safety. Our volunteers now also play a part in the success of this part of the service.

These pieces of work are a testament to the diversity of our staff knowledge and expertise.

In May 2013 we were inspected by the Care Inspectorate and were awarded the following grades:

Angus Women's Aid (Trading) Limited has now been set up as a company and this has been structured to raise funds for AWARE. We will provide training in violence against women issues for other agencies and will develop resources for use with women, children and young people. This will help towards our goal to become self-sufficient in future years.

Our team of multi-disciplinary professionals continue to work closely with Angus Violence Against Women Partnership to fulfil our vision which is "To make Angus a safer place to live so that women and children can realise their full potential".

#### Financial review

The results for the period are set out in the attached accounts.

The charity's current reserve policy is to maintain unrestricted funds, which are the free reserves of the charity, at a level which equates to approximately 3 months unrestricted expenditure. The charity has unrestricted funds which meet this reserves policy. This will ensure there will be sufficient funds to cover management, administration and support costs.

### Independent examiner's report to the trustees on the unaudited financial statements of Angus Womens Aid Ltd.

I report on the accounts for the year ended 31 March 2014 set out on pages 2 to 16.

#### Respective responsibilities of trustees and independent examiner

The charity's trustees (who are also the directors of the company for purposes of company law) are responsible for the preparation of the accounts in accordance with the terms of the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 (the Act) and the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006. ## Notes to financial statements for the year ended 31 March 2014

#### 1. Accounting policies

The principal accounting policies are summarised below. The accounting policies have been applied consistently throughout the year and the preceding year.

#### 1.1. Basis of accounting

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008), the Statement of Recommended Practice 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities' issued in March 2005 (SORP 2005) and the Companies Act 2006.

#### 1.2. Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds are expendable at the discretion of the board in furtherance of the objects of Angus Womens Aid expenditure. These funds are mainly given by statutory authorities.

Restricted funds are funds subject to specific purposes, which may be declared by the donors or with their authority (eg. by restricted wording or an appeal).

Transfers are made between funds to release capital grants and also to clear any funds in deficit.

#### 1.3. Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included in the statement of financial activities when the charity is entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy. The following specific policies are applied to particular categories of income:

Voluntary income is received by way of grants, donations and gifts and is included in full in the statement of financial activities when receivable. Grants where entitlement is not conditional on the delivery of a specific performance by the charity, are recognised when the charity becomes unconditionally entitled to the grant.

Donated services and facilities are included at the value to the charity where this can be quantified. The value of services provided by volunteers has not been included.

Gifts donated for resale are included as incoming resources within activities for generating funds when they are sold.

Grants, including grants for the purchase of fixed assets, are recognised in full in the statement of financial activities in the year in which they are receivable.

Income from investments is included in the year in which it is receivable.

### Notes to financial statements for the year ended 31 March 2014

#### 1.4. Resources expended

Expenditure is recognised on an accrual basis as a liability is incurred. Expenditure includes any VAT which cannot be fully recovered, and is reported as part of the expenditure to which it relates.

Costs of generating funds comprise the costs associated with attracting voluntary income and the costs of trading for fundraising purposes including the charity's shop.

Charitable expenditure comprises those costs incurred by the charity in the delivery of its activities and services for its beneficiaries. It includes both costs that can be allocated directly to such activities and those costs of an indirect nature necessary to support them.

Support costs are those costs incurred directly in support of expenditure on the objects of the charity and include project management.

#### 1.5. Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost less residual value of each asset over its expected useful life, as follows:
