## Report of the trustees (incorporating the directors' report) for the year ended 31 March 2015

The trustees present their report and the financial statements for the year ended 31 March 2015. The trustees, who are also directors of Angus Womens Aid Ltd for the purposes of company law and who served during the year and up to the date of this report are set out on page 1.

#### Structure, governance and management

Angus Women's Aid is a company limited by guarantee having no share capital and is governed by a Memorandum and Articles of Association. The company is registered as a charity in Scotland, charity number SC 013604.

The Trustees, who meet every month, administer the group. A manager is appointed by the Trustees to manage the day to day operations of the company. The Trustees are elected at the annual general meeting, 1/3 of Trustees are required to retire by rotation at the AGM but are eligible for re-election.

#### Objectives and activities

The principal activities of the charity in the period under review are:

To provide temporary refuge for women and children where the women have suffered abuse (mental, physical or sexual) in their home within a relationship with a man.

To offer support, information and help to any women and accompanying children who ask for help, whether or not they are refuge residents. Also to offer support and aftercare to any women and children who have left temporary refuge accommodation.

To promote equal opportunities for, and participation of, women in society to enable them to determine their future.

To provide opportunities for the educational and emotional needs of the children to be met, particularly those resident in refuge.

To encourage statutory authorities and other agencies to recognise their obligations, legal and otherwise, towards abused women and any accompanying children with respect to the abuse of women and its prevention.

To encourage research into the causes, the prevention and relief of such suffering and abuse of women.

Significant activities for achieving objectives

The charity continued to provide refuge and support to women and children suffering from abuse during the year.



## Report of the trustees (incorporating the directors' report) for the year ended 31 March 2015

### Achievements and performance

This has proved to be a challenging year for Angus Women's Aid that has resulted in stronger partnership working both at a local and national level for the CEO and her staff team. Not the least of the challenges faced is the issue of No Recourse to Public Funds and the increasing demand for translation and interpretation services in a landscape of funding cuts.

During this period Angus Women's Aid has strived to ensure the most efficient and effective use of available resources to continue to deliver a comprehensive, person centred range of support services to women, children and young people in Angus who have been or are "victims" of domestic abuse. The award of the following grades by the Care Inspectorate in November 2014:

Quality of Care and Support Very Good (5)

Quality of Staffing Very Good (5)

Quality of Management and Leadership Very Good (5)

for the second successive year is testament to the professionalism, skills and dedication of the staff team.

We have identified several key areas of development for the next year, one of which is the recruitment of new directors to meet the diversifying governance needs of the organisation as Angus Women's Aid encounters the wider implications of Violence against Women and Girls as outlined in Scottish Government's strategic document "Equally Safe".

Demand for our Children's Service has increased significantly over the past 12 months. CYP workers are now delivering Prevention Workshops to groups of young people in schools across Angus. We have also seen an increase in demand for our support service for children and young people. One notable increase is in the number of young people disclosing domestic abuse within their own relationships.

Last year we launched a significant piece of research we are undertaking in partnership with Dr lan Barron looking at the impact of Coercive Control on children. We will be publishing the findings of this ground breaking piece of work in 2016.

We have also noted a significant increase in the demand for our outreach women's service. So much so that we have had to make the very difficult decision to operate a waiting list.

As we look to the future we anticipate and welcome the changes it brings to Angus Women's Aid as we continue to develop directed by the needs of women, children and young people in Angus. Our multi-disciplinary staff team will continue to work in partnership with other agencies in Angus, both voluntary and statutory.

Angus Women's Aid will celebrate its 35th birthday in 2015. The Board, staff, volunteers and service users took part in 2 development days which will shape the development of Angus Women's Aid over the next 3 decades to ensure that we continue to respond to the needs of women, children and young people in Angus. Working in partnership across Angus "to make Angus a safer place to live so that women and children can realise their full potential.

#### Financial review

The results for the period are set out in the attached accounts.

The charity's current reserve policy is maintain unrestricted funds, which are the free reserves of the charity, at a level which equates to approximately 3 months unrestricted expenditure. The charity has unrestricted funds which meet this reserves policy. This ensures that there will be sufficient funds to cover management, administration and support costs.

### Notes to financial statements for the year ended 31 March 2015

#### 1. Accounting policies

The principal accounting policies are summarised below. The accounting policies have been applied consistently throughout the year and the preceding year.

#### 1.1. Basis of accounting

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008), the Statement of Recommended Practice 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities' issued in March 2005 (SORP 2005) and the Companies Act 2006.

#### 1.2. Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds are expendable at the discretion of the board in furtherance of the objects of Angus Womens Aid expenditure. These funds are mainly given by statutory authorities.

Restricted funds are funds subject to specific purposes, which may be declared by the donors or with their authority (eg. by restricted wording or an appeal).

Transfers are made between funds to release capital grants and also to clear any funds in deficit.

#### 1.3. Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included in the statement of financial activities when the charity is entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy. The following specific policies are applied to particular categories of income:

Voluntary income is received by way of grants, donations and gifts and is included in full in the statement of financial activities when receivable. Grants where entitlement is not conditional on the delivery of a specific performance by the charity, are recognised when the charity becomes unconditionally entitled to the grant.

Donated services and facilities are included at the value to the charity where this can be quantified. The value of services provided by volunteers has not been included.

Gifts donated for resale are included as incoming resources within activities for generating funds when they are sold.

Grants, including grants for the purchase of fixed assets, are recognised in full in the statement of financial activities in the year in which they are receivable.

Income from investments is included in the year in which it is receivable.



### Notes to financial statements for the year ended 31 March 2015

#### 1.4. Resources expended

Expenditure is recognised on an accrual basis as a liability is incurred. Expenditure includes any VAT which cannot be fully recovered, and is reported as part of the expenditure to which it relates.

Costs of generating funds comprise the costs associated with attracting voluntary income and the costs of trading for fundraising purposes including the charity's shop.

Charitable expenditure comprises those costs incurred by the charity in the delivery of its activities and services for its beneficiaries. It includes both costs that can be allocated directly to such activities and those costs of an indirect nature necessary to support them.

Support costs are those costs incurred directly in support of expenditure on the objects of the charity and include project management.

#### 1.5. Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost less residual value of each asset over its expected useful life, as follows:

Fixtures, fittings and equipment - 25% reducing balance Computer equipment - 33% straight line
