1 Accounting policies

1.1 Accounting convention

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention.

The company is financed via a loan from its parent company. The parent company has indicated that it will continue to support this company for a period of at least 12 months, and has cash resources and other assets sufficient to finance its operations and provide this support. The directors thus consider that the company will continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future and they therefore continue to adopt the going concern basis of accounting in preparing the financial statements.

The company has taken advantage of the exemption in Financial Reporting Standard No 1 from the requirement to produce a cash flow statement on the grounds that it is a small company.

1.2 Compliance with accounting standards

1.3 Turnover

Turnover represents rental income receivable.

1.4 Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Land and buildings are reviewed annually for impairment and the directors are of the opinion that their useful economic lives and residual values are such that any depreciation would not be material.

1.5 Deferred taxation

Deferred taxation is provided in full in respect of taxation deferred by timing differences between the treatment of certain items for taxation and accounting purposes. The deferred tax balance has not been discounted.
