STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document.

The charity is controlled by its governing document, a deed of trust, and constitutes a limited company, limited by guarantee, as defined by the Companies Act 2006.

The Trust is controlled by its governing document the Memorandum and Articles of Association dated 20 January 2010 with amendment to Articles 51 and 53 on 19th September 2012 and constitutes a limited company, limited by guarantee, as defined by the Companies Act 2006.

Recruitment and appointment of new trustees

The Trustees, who must be members of the company, are elected at the Annual General Meeting to serve for three years, but are then eligible for re-election. Further Trustees may be appointed by the Board at any time, to serve until the next Annual General Meeting, at which time they will be eligible for re-election for a further three years.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Organisational structure

The company is managed by a Board of Trustees elected by company members. The Board meets monthly or as required. Responsibility for finance is delegated to one of the Trustees who reports regularly to the Trustees as are other responsibilities such as property maintenance, heritage, genealogy and fund raising. The company does not have an administrative office and administration is carried out in the home of the Trustee responsible for the relevant administration.

Risk management

The Trustees have a duty to identify and review the risks to which the charity is exposed and to ensure appropriate controls are in place to provide reasonable assurance against fraud and error. The company has carried out risk assessments in connection with property maintenance and fund raising activities and has the appropriate Health and Safety Policy document in place. The company also has fully comprehensive Insurance in place.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and aims

The Abernethy Old Kirk Association exists to preserve the Abernethy Old Parish Church for weddings, funerals and occasional worship, to develop it as an historical, genealogical and education resource and to promote its use for appropriate exhibitions and events. The Association undertakes to maintain the fabric of the building and will encourage volunteers to assist with preservation work and to assist in its educational aims.

History and Significant activities

The Abernethy Old Kirk building can be found on OS Landranger Map (Grid Ref 006218) and is set on the rising ground of a glacial moraine above the river Spey, with the ruin of the 13th Century Castle Roy its close neighbour and the backdrop of the Cairngorm Mountains to the south. The site therefore has an ancient heritage. The building itself dates from the 18th century, built on the site of an earlier church, marked on a late 16th century map of the area and is a very fine example of traditional Highland ecclesiastical architecture (Historic Scotland Grade C listed). Inside, the unusual layout of the pews and several notable architectural features, combined with numerous mullioned windows providing light from many different angles, creates a unique atmosphere and a lasting impression on the visitor. The building has a floor area of 211 square metres and can house a gathering of approximately 350 people.

Concern over the future of Old Kirk was first raised by members of the Nethy Bridge Community Development Company (NBCDC) at its inaugural meeting. They asked its directors to investigate the possibility of saving the Old Kirk for the community following the decision by the Abernethy Kirk Session that it no longer wished to maintain two churches in the village. This led to a public meeting which was open to residents of Nethy Bridge and those from the wider area with an interest in the building. The Abernethy Old Kirk Association (AOKA) was therefore formed in January 2009 and initially operated under the umbrella of NBCDC. During 2009 AOKA decided that its aims were better served by being independent of NBCDC and consequently became incorporated as a separate company on the 9th February 2010 and registered with OSCR on 10 June 2010. Since inception, the Board of AOKA had been in discussions with the General Trustees of the Church of Scotland with a view to acquiring legal ownership of the building and in July 2010 AOKA was notified that the General Trustees had approved the sale of the Old Kirk to the company for the sum of £1,000 plus legal costs capped at £500. The building was conveyed to AOKA on 28 April 2011. Funding applications in respect of restoration work amounting to £37,880 were submitted and in January 2011 the Heritage Lottery Fund (HLF) awarded a maximum grant of £32,900 and in March 2011 the Cairngorm National Park Authority (CNPA) awarded a maximum grant of £4,980; the CNPA transferred a grant totalling £3775.05 to AOKA on the 1st March 2013. The second tranche of funding, £13,160 was received from HLF in June 2013 and the third and final tranche of £3,120 in October 2013 thus enabling the completion of the renovation of the fabric of the building within the expected timescale.

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

Charitable activities

AOKA has hosted 6 funerals, 3 weddings, 1 bike race, 5 exhibitions, 1 concert, 1 commemorative service, the Doors Open Days weekend and attended the local Spring Gathering and Highland Games Events. AOKA has been able to collect donations for local dementia group Dachaidh and the Royal British Legion. 2000 visitors have attended the exhibitions with another 1000 attending the funerals, weddings, concert and service.

Allowing access to the building encourages donations, interest in the project, offers of help, comments and advice and AOKA is able to offer help with visitors' genealogy research. A WW1 display commenced in April and is planned to continue for 5 years. Local stories can be read, artefacts, war diaries, photographs viewed, information is added regularly and local schools have been invited to use the facility.

The property has been greatly improved in both efficiency and comfort with the completion of the modern heating system and LED lighting. This has also reduced the CO2 emissions and improved the "green awareness code". Regarding health and safety, no accidents/injuries have occurred.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Reserves policy

Under the Articles of Association the company must ensure that all funds are applied towards achieving the objectives of the company. The company will ensure that there are sufficient funds to cover its commitments for the following 12 months. The company does not borrow money.

Financial position

Unrestricted income (fund raising, fees from weddings, funerals and exhibitions, together with donations) amounted to £9,453, an increase of £1,782 over the previous year. Direct charitable expenditure and fund raising expenditure totalled £9,512, a reduction of £2,244 compared to 2014, Governance costs increased by £120 and overall, this produced a small deficit of £59, considerably smaller than the deficit of the previous year of £3,965.

There was no restricted income or expenditure in the year to 31 March 2015. In the previous financial year the balance of restricted funds of £4,681 were fully utilised.

The deficit of £59 for the year when added to the balance brought forward of £11,342 gives total funds of £11,283 as at 31 March 2015

Cash at bank was £9437 with cash in hand of £20.

The reinstatement cost of the Old Kirk is £749,000.

CONCLUSION

The members of the Board wish to express their appreciation of the support and generosity which the company receives from its funders, supporters, donors, volunteers and interested parties from the local area and from within the UK and abroad. 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008), the Companies Act 2006 and the requirements of the Statement of Recommended Practice, Accounting and Reporting by Charities.

Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included on the Statement of Financial Activities when the charity is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy.

Resources expended

Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Land and buildings

- 20% on cost

Stocks

Stocks are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value, after making due allowance for obsolete and slow moving items.

Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.
