- We worked with STEM education and delivered a series of STEM training session in a school to helping them adapt their Micro:bit devices to assist with care in the community.

There are many ten of thousands of people with dementia in Scotland alone and the company has set about trying to build its presence on the internet to engage with a wider group (http://www.rapport.net and http://addon.care)

The company has been building close relationship with partners serving similar communities over this period (including Brain Injury Rehabilitation Trust (BIRT) the University of Stirling and The Digital Health & Care institute, Alzheimer Scotland and Joint Improvement Team (JIT). The company has been consulting mostly with care providers to develop a range of workshops and assistive technologies. We have also been working with small groups of people with Dementia and their care givers seeking to raise their awareness, confidence and competency in working a number of the most beneficial assistive technologies such as using a smart watch to monitor physiology and keep care givers engaged when the bodies physiology systems are not working well.

We are helping carer givers to use wearable devices with those they care for to keep them safe and connected to care givers and will continue to offer support, services and software that help people achieve good results with this type of approach.

We consulted mostly with care givers rather than those with dementia but have been seeking to consulting more directly with those with dementia as general user knowledge of assistive technology improves and users find it easier to understand the potential.
