HERE + NOW designs places and participatory processes. The company has been involved in a wide range of projects this year, and the original approach to frame these under the activities of 'engage', 'design' and 'curate' has offered a good structure for our activity.

ENGAGE We aim to bridge the gap between the people designing a place and the people using it, by putting people at the heart of design. We do this by ensuring the community of interest is always involved in, and that they feel a part of the design process of their local places. This year we have worked on 4 projects focused on engagement, including:

- <u>SETTINGS FOR LEARNING</u> a piloting project to explore new ways of encouraging greater use of outdoor spaces as effective settings for learning.
- <u>PEP TALKS CANONMILLS</u> a social engagement event inviting local people and businesses to get together and discuss opportunities and the potential of the local place. Supported with kick-starter funding from Architecture + Design Scotland.

 DALRY COLONIES RESIDENTS WORKSHOP was a community briefing co-design workshop to engage local residents in a process which identified a series of design ideas for the local area. Subsequently we designed a 42m length of hoarding and prepared the graphic illustration which resulted from the community brief.

Projects focused on our 'engage' strand of work accounted for 20% of HERE+NOW's activity in 2015.

DESIGN HERE+NOW believe that all design is an iterative process. We design places by using more inclusive participatory processes throughout each project, and encouraging clients to adopt an engagement-led approach. By doing this our community benefits with more sensitive placemaking which is more meaningful to the community and better meets our community of interest's needs. This is an added value we offer compared with how projects are generally done by the industry and which a more commercial company would not have the capacity to achieve or focus on. In 2015, HERE+NOW has undertaken XXX projects with a design focus - landscape architecture or urban design. This accounts for 40% of our overall activity in 2015, and we have worked on 13 design projects, including:

- GLENBOIG PARK a landscape context for a housing development in Glenboig;
- GATE 55 a garden park strategy for a local community centre offering a strategy for future delivery of a series of enhancement projects to the outdoor space;
- <u>EH15 PARK</u> a series of park design options for a further second stage of community consultation in partnership with the Edinburgh + Lothians Greenspace Trust.

CURATE We curate exhibitions, events and published works, which aim to share with the community of interest the process that a design has gone through, building ownership and including people in the design process. We have done this process on 6 projects this year. A brief summary of the activities we have curated to share our processes includes:

- Revealing the outputs of our work in a 2015 document which was printed and distributed to our contacts, and made available on the HERE+NOW website;
- Capturing thoughts and observations in a blog on the HERE+NOW website;
- Proposals for work / meetings with potential collaborators where we always promote a process of design iteration supported by a strategy for community engagement;
- <u>City Link Festival / Hold Me Dear</u> an outdoor exhibition installed for a month in an underused space in Edinburgh; this exhibition and the volunteer and launch events associated with it brought the Rodney Street Tunnel to life for a month in August 2015;
- <u>Feeling of Connection to Place exhibition</u> installed and exhibited in 3 locations around Edinburgh (the Tent Gallery, the Biscuit Factory, and the Hidden Door Festival)

In addition to sharing findings and best practice, we believe in the value of feeding information and ideas forward (Feedback / Feedforward). Continually evolving our approach and services is a way of ensuring we are always acting in the best interest of our community and keep the dialogue open. 'Curation' projects have accounted for 40% of our activity.

In 2015, our stakeholders have been consulted in the following ways:

- OPEN STUDIO an event in December 2015 inviting our clients and communities of interest from the projects completed during 2015 to provide feedback on how they feel our first year has gone. Gathering people in a physical event offered a place in which our stakeholders could make suggestions for improvement. Their comments have all been taken on board in our planned activities for 2016.
- <u>FEEDBACK</u> has been invited in an integrated way on each project during the year e.g. feedback boards where, using large boards installed at key events, exhibitions and workshops during the year our stakeholders were able to contribute their opinions and feelings about how each project was being delivered as feedback. For example:
 - Two large 89cm x 200cm boards at our Hold Me Dear community exhibition event in September 2015 where stakeholders could comment and feedback on our work;
 - One 1x2m panel painted with blackboard paint where attendees were invited to contribute using stickers at the PEP talk community event in April, and with chalk pens at our open studio event in December, responding to questions around what Co-design means for them and sharing ideas for future Co-designed projects.
- <u>SURVEY</u> at the end of December 2015 we sent emails to key stakeholders individuals and organisations we'd worked with over this year requesting feedback
 and comments on our approaches, activities and outputs. Overall, respondents felt we
 offered value for money on the projects we'd worked with them on in 2015, that fees
 were in line with other suppliers in our industry, and that they would recommend us to
