Directors' report

The directors present their directors' report together with the audited financial statements of the Company for the year ended 31 March 2019.

Principal activity and business review (including principal risks and uncertainties)

The Company is a wholly owned subsidiary of NTR Green Energy Holdings Limited. The Company had an investment in a potential wind farm development that was impaired in full in the year ended 31 March 2017.

Subsequent events

Subsequent to the year end, having not traded for a number of years, the directors resolved to arrange for the orderly wind-up of the business. As such the directors believe that the Company currently faces no risks or uncertainties.

On 12 November 2020, the Company's directors declared a resolution of the intention to liquidate the Company. Details are provided in note 8 to the financial statements.

Going Concern

On 12 November 2020, having carefully considered the Company's financial position and proposals, the directors resolved to arrange for the orderly wind-up of the affairs of the Company and for the Company to be struck off. This wind-up process is expected to be completed by 31 March 2021. Accordingly, these financial statements are presented on a wind-up basis of accounting where all assets are stated at their estimated recoverable amounts and a provision is made for operating losses expected to be incurred up to the date the Company will cease to trade, including the estimated cost of wind-up. At year end, all assets have been stated at their recoverable amounts. As trading has ceased no provision is required for the operating losses expected to be incurred up to the date the entity will be struck off. The estimated costs of wind-up will be borne by the parent company.

The balance sheet as set out on page 9, discloses an excess of liabilities over assets at 31 March 2020 of £43,740 (2019: £85,952).

Results and state of affairs

The statement of profit and loss and other comprehensive income for the year ended 31 March 2020 and the balance sheet at that date are set out on pages 8 and 9 respectively. The company made a profit for the financial year of £42,212 (2019: £Nil).

The directors do not recommend the payment of a dividend (2019: £Nil).

1 Significant accounting policies

(a) Basis of preparation

AOE Windfarm 2 Limited (the "Company") is a private limited company incorporated, domiciled and registered in Scotland. The registered number is SC521979 and the registered address is 13 Queen's Road, Aberdeen, AB15 4YL.

The Company is exempt by virtue of s400 of the Companies Act 2006 from the requirement to prepare group financial statements. These financial statements present information about the Company as an individual undertaking and not about its group.

These financial statements were prepared in accordance with Financial Reporting Standard 101 Reduced Disclosure Framework ("FRS 101").

In preparing these financial statements, the Company applies the recognition, measurement and disclosure requirements of International Financial Reporting Standards as adopted by the EU ("Adopted IFRSs"), but makes amendments where necessary in order to comply with the Companies Act 2006 and has set out below where advantage of the FRS 101 disclosure exemptions has been taken.

In these financial statements, the Company has applied the exemptions available under FRS 101 in respect of the following disclosures:

- A cash flow statement and related notes;
- Comparative year reconciliations for share capital;
- Disclosures in respect of transactions with wholly owned subsidiaries:
- Disclosures in respect of capital management;
- The effects of new but not yet effective IFRSs; and
- Disclosures in respect of the compensation of key management personnel.

The financial statements have been prepared in Pounds Sterling, the functional currency of the Company.

The accounting policies set out below have, unless otherwise stated, been applied consistently to all periods presented in these financial statements.

(b) Going concern

On 12 November 2020, having carefully considered the Company's financial position and proposals, the directors resolved to arrange for the orderly wind-up of the affairs of the Company and for the Company to be struck off. This wind-up process is expected to be completed by 31 March 2021. (c) Trade and other payables

Trade and other payables are recognised initially at fair value and subsequently measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method.

(d) Income tax

Income tax on the result for the year comprises current and deferred tax. Income tax is recognised in profit or loss, except to the extent that it relates to items recognised in other comprehensive income or directly in equity, in which case it is recognised in other comprehensive income or directly in equity.

Current tax is the expected tax payable on the taxable income for the year, using tax rates enacted or substantively enacted at the reporting date, and any adjustment to tax payable in respect of previous periods.

Deferred tax is provided using the balance sheet liability method, providing for temporary differences between the carrying amounts of assets and liabilities for financial reporting purposes and the amounts used for taxation purposes. The following temporary differences are not provided for: those arising on the initial recognition of assets or liabilities that affect neither accounting or taxable profit; and differences relating to retained earnings in subsidiaries, to the extent that they are controlled by the Company and will probably not reverse in the foreseeable future. The amount of deferred tax provided is based on the expected manner of realisation or settlement of the carrying amount of assets and liabilities, using tax rates enacted or substantively enacted at the reporting date. A deferred tax asset is recognised only to the extent that it is probable that future taxable profits will be available against which the asset can be utilised. Deferred tax assets are reduced to the extent that it is no longer probable that the related tax benefit will be realised.
