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REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30TH APRIL 2023

The trustees who are also directors of the charity for the purposes of the Companies Act 2006, present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 30th April 2023. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019).

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

The company's objects are:

- i. To educate the public and pupils in matters pertaining to bird welfare in general and the prevention of cruelty and suffering, as well as their roles in local, national and global ecosystems.
- ii. ii. To promote for the benefit of the public the conservation and protection of natural environment by promoting rehabilitation and wild release of indigenous species, and propagation of those that are endangered or at risk.

- iii. iii. To promote humane behaviour towards animals, in particular, but not restricted to birds, by providing appropriate care, protection, treatment and security for those which are in need of care and attention by reason of sickness, maltreatment, poor circumstances or ill usage.

REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30TH APRIL 2023

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

I am proud to write you regarding our progress again this year. This year easily signifies the greatest growth and accomplishments ever experienced by our year old organisation. You have been essential to this year's national 33 international accomplishments. We hope you'll make even more possible in future. This year was trying indeed-we've continued taking on overflow from other closed or struggling organisations, Avian Influenza and algal blooms destroying pelagics and other shorebirds, and then of course, ever-increasing needs presenting from governmental organisations such as the SSPCA, begging our help here in the Highlands. All of these pressures have created a perfect storm in terms of work. I'm proud to say we have met every challenge thus far, 24 hours per day. Our greatest challenge this year? The shocking closure of the SSPCA's ONLY satellite office servicing the Caithness and Sutherland area-essentially, the top third of mainland U.K., thereby overnight doubling our intake. We are the only avian-only rescue centre in the far north as of this closure, and have nothing near the resources our predecessor (SSPCA's centre) had. The SSPCA already relied heavily upon us, more year over year, but now, we are the only critical link between injured wildlife and emergency aid/rehabilitation. Please continue to help us to provide for this most underserved area in the U.K. The need is critical and emergent. Our dedication has lead to a much-needed expansion of a wildlife centre also here in our town, headed by ever-diligent employee Jane Wilson. We grow from strength to strength and have been positively featured in 28 news sources in 36 months all over Great Britain. Blue Highlands has remained a light of hope in Stygian times. We have become the go-to location for governmental and NGO referrals as well as for the public in general, providing advice, education, rehabilitation and critical care. We have also become the reference location of choice for five different veterinary practices for bird rehabilitation. This year we also performed a successful bi-lateral cataract surgery using phacoemulsification on huge eagle first of its kind worldwide, with our associates at the University Scottish Vet Referrals in Inverness. Two scientific papers are currently being written about this unusual case, in order to pave the way for such procedures for other birds of prey globally. Beyond this, we have been forging alliances internationally, the latest is collaboration on this year's Snowy Owl release on the European mainland. Of the three young snowies we raised in our ENCORE species survival programme, two of them are fit for wild release (the third remaining with us to make this magnificent taxon available for education and awareness work-specially pressing given the fragility of the Arctic tundra habitat). Because their more normative habitat is, of course, on the Continent, we are establishing long-term collaborations and firm relationships with like-minded organisations governments dedicated to endangered wildlife survival. Currently two gentlemen colleagues of ours (the Global Owl Project) are working with us to change continental laws permanently to allow for the wild release of Snowy owls to re-establish themselves in the Swedish and Finnish original breeding sites. They are also trying to suspend the current law to allow for Blue Highlands and only Blue Highlands to release as a test project as of next year. This will help to establish the U.K. as a leader among nations in wildlife conservation. These, along with many other breakthrough accomplishments, including our participation in new legislation preventing the destruction of red-listed birds' eggs and nests, as well as providing refuge for any thus orphaned (and/or persecuted) individuals, have been in no small part made possible by your dedication and generosity to this organisation. On the part of the voiceless wildlife we represent, we thank you, and look forward to seeing you and sharing more progress with you soon.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Financial position

Blue Highlands Raptor & Avian Conservation Centre suffered an overall deficit of £5,521 (2022 Surplus: £123. Total income for the year was £44,334 (2022: £49,478) and total expenditure was £49,855 (2022: £49,355).

The charity currently holds £6,000 of reserves at 30/04/2023.

The company is a recognised charity and as a result there is no liability on the company's income.

ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charitable company, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.

Pension costs and other post-retirement benefits

The charitable company operates a defined contribution pension scheme. Contributions payable to the charitable company's pension scheme are charged to the Statement of Financial Activities in the period to which they relate.
